

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




There are countless ways to sit, almost all of which require some kind of seat.



Once you pick a quad, stick with your quad, even as the train empties out. Refrain from working your quads in the quad.





The ottoman traces its roots all the way back to the Ottoman Empire.




Public transit food pyramid





Priority Seating is located in the first few rows, near the bus driver.








Proper hygiene is one of the cornerstones of our civilization.










Personal odour spectrum


