GO EXPANSION

GO service is expanding to serve you better - with more frequent service, more stations, cleaner technology and more connections. Across the entire network, our goal is to deliver 6,000 train trips a week - so you won't need a schedule because you know the next train will be coming soon. We're transforming GO Transit to bring more frequent two-way, all-day service to the Lakeshore East line, seven days a week.

The work has already started on the Lakeshore East line to get you where you need to go, better, faster and easier.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Rouge River Bridge Rehabilitation project is part of GO Expansion and supports a larger, system-wide plan to improve GO rail service on core segments of the network. The bridge is a heritage property of provincial significance, and has been in-service for 117 years. The planned bridge rehabilitation will extend the life-cycle of the bridge structure by another 20 years.

The Rouge River bridge is located at the mouth of the Rouge River, crossing two municipalities: the City of Toronto to the west, and the City of Pickering to the east along the Lakeshore East rail corridor.



IMPROVEMENTS

The general scope of work is to rehabilitate the bridge and will include:

- Superstructure repairs: Blast cleaning, coating all structural steel and steel surfaces. Repair, strengthening and replacement of structural steel members.
- Substructure repairs: Masonry stone repairs for the abutments and piers, crack injections and concrete path repairs, grout repairs at the approach span bearing pedestals and bearing replacement.
- Deck: Replacement of timber deck ties and track, relocation and protection of existing communication utilities.
- Approaches: Addition of approach slab, replacement of retaining walls, replacement of 25m of track on each side.



BENEFITS

- The planned bridge rehabilitation will extend the life-cycle of the bridge structure by another 20 years.
- This rehabilitation work will require a significantly smaller construction footprint and will greatly reduce impacts to the surrounding communities compared to a full bridge replacement.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- The rehabilitation of the bridge will not result in significant changes to the historic structure of the bridge. Rehabilitation work is happening to increase the bridge's life span.
- We have worked closely with our partners to minimize impacts on Rouge Park visitors, and park access will remain open.
- Bridge rehabilitation activities may generate some sound during the daytime and when work is being completed overnight.

COMING UP

- Construction will commence in September 2021 and will be ongoing until Spring 2022.
- To ensure Lakeshore East rail service levels are maintained throughout this project, work that requires access to the track(s) will be completed during the overnight period or pre-planned weekend closures. Work that can be completed from the soffit, or underside of the bridge, will be completed during the day.
- Care will be taken to ensure the work does not impact the Rouge River or adjacent natural areas.
- Work that is accessed from the park will begin first and will include: scaffolding and enclosure set-up; structure steel repair works; abrasive blasting and painting; and, substructure repair works.
- Work that will be conducted from track level (and will be accessed by Rodd Avenue) includes: bridge deck tie and rail replacement; retaining wall replacements; installation of new approach slabs and backwalls; and, replacement of approach ties and rails.
- All schedules are are approximate and may change.
