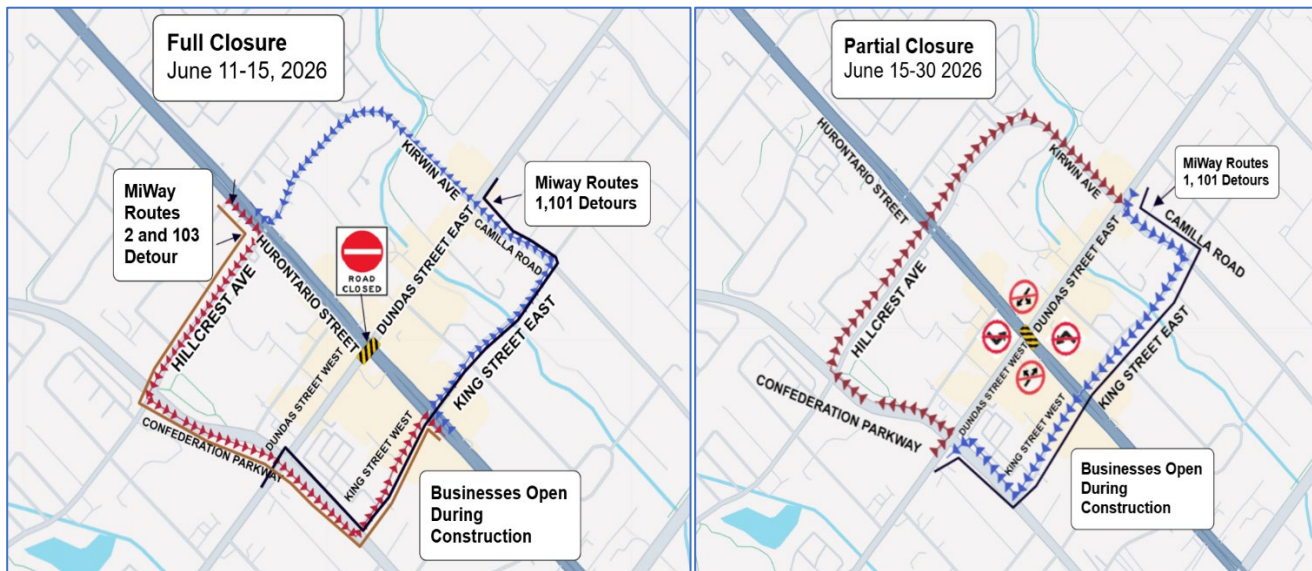


Full Intersection Closure at Dundas Street and Hurontario Street

Beginning June 11, 2026 at 7 p.m. to June 15, 2026 at 5 a.m.

Partial Intersection Closure for Track Installation at Dundas Street and Hurontario Street

Beginning June 15, 2026 at 5 a.m. to June 30, 2026 at 10 p.m.



Project Overview

The Hazel McCallion Line project will be an 18-kilometre, 19-stop light rail service connecting people from the Port Credit GO station to the Brampton Gateway Terminal.

What You Need to Know

- June 11 -15, 2026: Hurontario Street and Dundas Street will undergo a full intersection closure for utility and electrical work related to the traction power substation. Detours will be in place via Hillcrest Avenue, Confederation Parkway, King Street, Camilla Road and Kirwin Avenue, and crews will work 24/7.
- June 15 – 30, 2026: Track installation will be completed in a single stage to reduce impacts and shorten the construction period. East-west traffic will be restricted, and northbound and southbound left turns will not be permitted. The northbound left turn restriction will remain permanent following construction. Detours will be in place throughout the work, while northbound and southbound through traffic will remain open.
- Businesses will remain open and accessible.

Transit services will be detoured during the closures, including MiWay Routes 1, 2, 101 and 103. Please visit www.miway.ca/updates for updates on your bus route. Please visit www.gotransit.com for updates on your GO bus route.

Traffic signal timings will be adjusted to keep people moving. Pedestrian crossings will be maintained at a signalized crosswalk. Please follow the installed signs while navigating around the closure.

In accordance with City of Mississauga Noise By-Law Exemption requirements, this notice is meant to advise that residents near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, triaxles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

Please note, work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. Please see roadway signage for the latest information. If you require the most up-to-date information, please reach out to peel@metrolinx.com and our team will provide you with e-updates of this work.

TIMING

- Full closure of Hurontario Street and Dundas Street intersection is scheduled from June 11 at 7 p.m. to June 15 at 5 a.m.
- Partial intersection closure restricting east-west traffic and left turns in the intersection is scheduled from June 15 at 5 a.m. to June 30 at 10 p.m..
- Construction is scheduled to take place 24/7, Monday through Sunday.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- All traffic movements will be closed at the intersection from June 11 to 15 at Hurontario Street and Dundas Street.
- East-west traffic will be restricted from June 15 to 30 at Hurontario Street and Dundas Street, as well as north and southbound left turns.
- Detours will be available from Hillcrest Avenue, Confederation Parkway, King Street, Camilla Road and Kirwin Avenue.
- The northbound left turn movement from Hurontario Street onto Dundas Street will be permanently closed.
- Access for Emergency Services across Hurontario Street at Dundas Street will not be maintained.

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas.

- Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians as detours may be required.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

PROPERTY DETAILS

- Crews will not require property access for this work.
