


Guideway Construction, Utility Connections and Road Widening between Pinetree Way and Park Street

Guideway Construction: March 17, 2026, to Late April - 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.



Project Overview

The Hazel McCallion Line project will be an 18-kilometre, 19-stop light rail service connecting people from the Port Credit GO station to the Brampton Gateway Terminal.

What You Need to Know

Beginning March 17, 2026 crews will be starting work on the intersection at Hurontario Street and Indian Valley/Pinewood Trail. During this work, there will be restricted vehicular access to Indian Valley and Pinewood Trail from Hurontario Street. Left turns will not be permitted at the intersection. Access to and from Indian Valley Trail to Hurontario Street will be available via Mineola Road and Glenburnie Road. Access to and from Pinewood Trail will be available via Mineola Road and Goldthorpe Road. This intersection will become signalized during guideway construction work.

Crews will begin center guideway construction north of Hampshire Crescent. Traffic staging will allow residents to exit Hampshire Crescent by making left turns to travel northbound, with entry permitted only by making right turns from southbound Hurontario street. Left turn from northbound Hurontario onto the crescent will be restricted for motorists' safety. Traffic lanes will be reduced to one lane northbound and one lane southbound.

Crews will also be widening the roadway, conducting a cable pulling operation to one of the Traction Power Substations (TPSS) and other utility connections from north of Eaglewood Boulevard to Park Street.

Traffic signal timings will be adjusted to keep people moving. Pedestrian crossings will be maintained at a signalized crosswalk. Please follow the signs installed to assist with navigating around the closure. Transit services will be impacted by these construction works. In accordance with City of Mississauga Noise By-Law Exemption requirements, this notice is meant to advise that residents near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, triaxles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

Please note, work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. Please see roadway signage for the latest information. If you require the most up-to-date information, please reach out to peel@metrolinx.com and our team will provide you with e-updates of this work.

TIMING

- Intersection work is scheduled to begin March 17, 2026, to Late April from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Construction can be scheduled from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Sunday.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Eastbound and westbound movements across Hurontario Street at Indian Valley/Pinewood Trail will not be permitted in each direction.
- Left turns from Hurontario Street to Indian Valley, Pinewood Trail and Hampshire Crescent will not be permitted.
- Access to and from Indian Valley Trail to Hurontario Street will be available via Mineola Road and Glenburnie Road.
- Access to and from Pinewood Trail will be available via Mineola Road and Goldthorpe Road.
- Access to Hampshire Crescent will be available from Hurontario Street southbound traffic lanes
- U-turns for large vehicles will not be permitted at Pinetree Way and Mineola Road intersections.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, tri-axles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRANSIT DETAILS

- Visit MiWay.ca for updates on your bus route.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.

PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas.
- Sidewalk access in the area could be affected.
- Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians as detours may be required.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

PROPERTY DETAILS

- Crews will not require property access for this work.
