

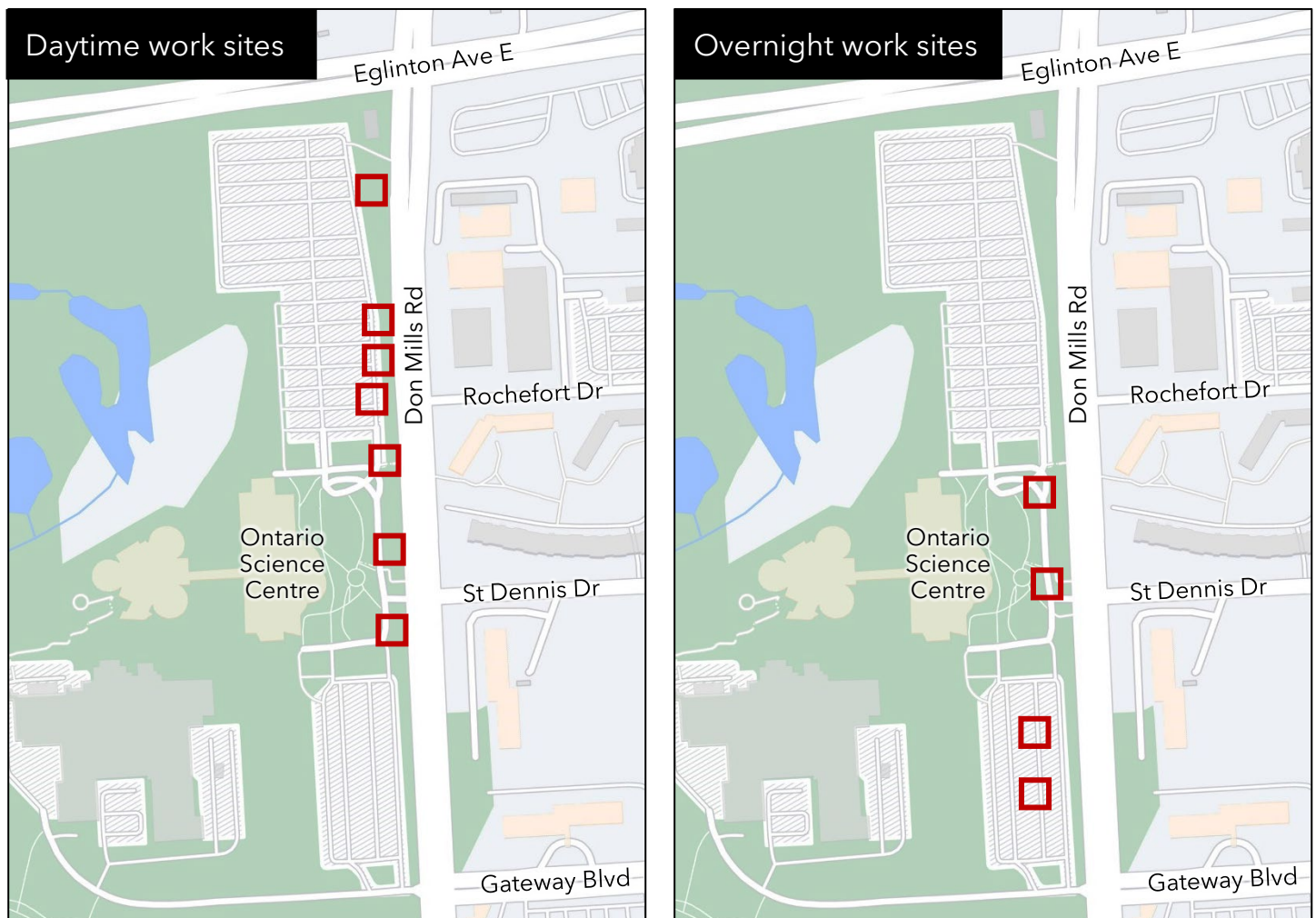
# Daytime and overnight drilling along Don Mills Road

**Expected start date:** As early as May 31, 2023

**Expected duration:** Up to one week

**Hours of work:** Daytime work from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Some overnight work from 6:30 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. See maps below.



## What is happening?

- Metrolinx will drill boreholes to study ground conditions. Using this information, Metrolinx will determine the construction approach for the Ontario Line subway project.

## What to expect

- Residents near the work area may hear noise from drilling, hydrovac trucks, and other construction equipment.
- Some work will take place overnight in order to minimize impacts to the Ontario Science Centre during their visitor hours.
- All the necessary permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.

## About the project

- The Ontario Line will be a 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- The line will bring 15 new stations to the city and will run from Exhibition Place, through downtown, all the way to Don Mills Road and Eglinton Avenue East.
- It will accommodate nearly 400,000 daily trips and provide significant relief from crowding throughout the existing transit network thanks to connections to more than 40 other subway, GO train, LRT, streetcar, and bus routes.
