



	ACTION ITEM	RESPONSE	STATUS
1	A CLC member requested additional cleaning of the alleyway behind the site, as well as the roads surrounding the site.	Metrolinx and OTG have reviewed site cleanliness. Focus is placed on mitigations at site to minimize impact outside of the site. Cleaning of ingress and egress to site is implemented when required. No additional cleaning outside of the site is planned at this time.	Closed

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

	TOPIC	RESPONSE
1	Pentabeam works	Pentabeam works started in mid-August. The hyrdodemolition phase of this work is expected to be completed this week. Noise mitigation measures implemented for this specific work includes placing noise blanket surrounding fencing and limiting operating hours for some machinery to 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. OTG took these corrective actions in response to community feedback. Crews expect to complete all works related to the pentabeam by mid September.
2	Current phase of works	Due to adjustments with pentabeam works, the current stage of shaft excavation is expected to continue in to early September, along with the excavation of footings and the pentabeam, which involves breaking concrete and rock. Once excavation is complete, the structural phase will begin, which will include the installation of steel elements such as walers and struts. This phase of work is expected for approximately 3 weeks.
3	Hours of work	 North site: 24-hour shifts (Monday - Saturday), with occasional Sunday work as needed. South site: 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, with occasional weekends. Work hours may be adjusted in consideration of the particular work underway and construction sequence. During this current phase of work, crews are expected to work from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. during weekdays (Monday through Friday). Crews may work on Saturdays and Sundays from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. during the weekend.
4	Mitigations in place	To reduce impacts to residents and businesses in the area, mitigations are in place including air quality, noise, and vibration monitoring, site hoarding, additional paved areas, and sprinkler systems for dust suppression. At the South site, additional mitigations have been added during rock breaking excavation as well as pentabeam works.
5	Completion dates - excavation	 North site: Excavation and cavern work is expected to be complete in early 2026. South site: Excavation is expected to be complete by the end of 2025. Additional phases of station construction will follow.

Queen-Spadina Construction Update



CURRENT WORKS: QUEEN-SPADINA CAVERN


- Excavation of the cavern is ongoing; both headwalls have been reached and now crews are continuing to widen and deepen the interior of the space.
- This cavern will connect the north and south station entrances to the tunnel and will house the future station platform.
- In addition to excavating rock, shotcrete and rock bolts are being installed for support.
- Expected completion of the cavern excavation is early 2026.



Future connection will be made with the south site in the cavern at the Queen-Spadina

CURRENT WORKS: QUEEN-SPADINA CAVERN

Crews continue to excavate the cavern, to accommodate the full width and depth needed for tunnel boring machines, as well as the future station platform and tracks.




As of September 2025

Green = completed excavation


Pink = next stage of excavation

CURRENT WORKS: QUEEN-SPADINA SOUTH SITE

- The most recent rock breaking level is completed.
- The current phase of work include the installation of walers and struts. This phase of work expected to be completed in approximately 3 weeks.
- Crews are also advancing installation of a pentabeam structure to connect the station shaft and cavern. This work is underway and expected to be completed by mid-September.
- Additional noise mitigation measures have been implemented for pentabeam hydrodemolition, including placing noise blankets on surrounding fencing, focusing this work from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on weekdays, and avoiding machine use in areas with the highest noise levels.
- Current hours of work at the site are 11:00 p.m., Monday to Saturday, with occasional Sunday shifts. Works hours may be adjusted.

UPCOMING WORK: CONNECTING THE SOUTH SHAFT AND CAVERN

To connect the station shaft and cavern crews will install a pentabeam structure for support. In the future, passengers will pass through this area to access the Ontario Line platforms.




Diagram of the Queen-Spadina south station design
