

Transit Priority Signals

You should that without transit priority signals, traffic will go out of hand between the LRV's on rail and the cars on the road and not only that, but also the LRV's could cause delays, or even worse: COLLISION!





ANSWER: Transit Priority Signals

Transit signals have been installed along the At-Grade section and they may be activated during some stages of the testing phase. Various testing phases will occur to evaluate general vehicle movements and the integration between the transit signals and roadway signals. The LRVs will follow the roadway signals before the transit signals are fully operational. As such, potential risk of collisions would be minimal.

Several mitigation measures have been taken to ensure that LRVs will operate safely along the corridor during the testing phases. Signal

timing plans have been adjusted at the At-Grade intersections as part of the mitigation measures, and PDOs will be deployed to assist at intersection crossings for the first week of clearance testing.







Many stations will have retail, such as Mount Dennis, Forest Hill, Leaside, and Science Centre Stations, to name a few. Although, not necessarily "cafes".





The station descriptions are incomplete and out-of-date. (http://www.thecrosstown.ca/stations_stops) Could Metrolinx update them? One thing missing is the number of levels (service, concourse, platform, etc.) at each underground station. Example of out-of-date: the Aga Khan Park & Museum description says "accessible stop will be a centre platform or parallel side platform"; I believe it's side platforms.

Tedford Dr. and still live here. Since we moved here the Golden Mile for me and thousands of other kids and adults like me had, and still have, a connection to the Golden Mile. It once housed a large movie theatre where we saw many of the early Elvis movies. The Watt's restaurant was once located here, now located in the Eglinton Square. When we moved here in 1954 there was a sparse housing development beyond Warden. The Golden Mile has an historical significance to the community north and south between Pharmacy and Victoria Park. The Queen of England thought it was significant enough to make the journey here, shouldn't we honour that significance for the historical purposes?

Naming principles were established and applied consistently across the regional transit network. A "meeting" was not held, but public input was sought for proposed names in October 2015 online.

Metrolinx's Design Excellence team completed a study on regional transit wayfinding harmonization including station, stop, and interchange naming. As part of this, a set of principles was established for selecting names which, applied consistently across the regional transit network, will help to make transit easier to navigate and avoid customer confusion.



 $ANSWER: The \ Bus \ Facility \ at the \ Science \ Centre \ Station \ is \ designed \ to \ provide \ seamless \ and \ efficient \ connections \ with \ ECLRT \ services. \ The$ large, open, fully glazed terminal simplifies navigation. An underground connection to the main station concourse avoids any interference between passenger circulation and bus traffic, while simultaneously providing a completely weather protected, secure and safe environment.

Use of natural light is a defining feature of stations across the system. The iconic glass box not only creates an architectural expression that unifies the stations across the system, but also emphasizes transparency to create a bright welcoming space that passengers will perceive as natural, safe and healthy. Harvesting natural light also reduces artificial lighting requirements, reducing energy consumption and maintenance.
