Overview

- On March 5, Metrolinx and Infrastructure Ontario identified Strabag as the team who will design, build and finance the tunnel for the Scarborough Subway Extension.
- Strabag has since completed the removal of the former car dealerships and started to build the launch shaft for the tunnel boring machine (TBM).
- To support excavation, piling activities began, and were completed in early September.
- On September 17, the procurement process to build the stations, rails and systems (SRS) began with the release of a Request for Qualifications to shortlist qualified bidders.
- Preparatory works continue along the project alignment.



What's Happening with the Tunneling Contract

Along with tunnelling, working also includes:

- Excavation of the launch shaft (McCowan and Sheppard)
- Excavation of the extraction shaft (Midland and Eglinton)
- Headwall construction at stations and various locations along the route
- Emergency exit building construction
- Tunnel boring machine name contest stay tuned!




- STRABAG is an Austrian-based company and a global leader in tunnelling technologies

- For this project Strabag is building one launch shaft, one extraction shaft, five headwalls for future stations and 14 headwalls for future emergency evacuation buildings.






Tunnel Timeline


