What work is taking place?

Crews will be mobilizing to Kimridge & Wolcott Avenue as early as February 2022 to begin construction activities in the area to support the installation of Retaining Wall 10 and 14. Work will also continue on the Danforth and Warden bridge widenings to stage 2 and stage 3. A summary of all construction activities in the area, along with the anticipated durations for each, has been included below.

Grading	March 2022	Approx. 1 Month	Day & Night Shift	Preparatory work for the retaining wall installation and construction of an access road. Equipment for this work includes: a dozer, excavator, and dump trucks.
Concrete Retaining Wall 10	April 2022	Approx. 11 months	Day Shift	The retaining wall is made up of reinforced concrete and backfilled with earth to ground elevation. Equipment for this work includes: an excavator, dump truck, and concrete trucks and pump.

Electrical Raceway Installation	December 2022	Approx. 2 months	Day & Night Shift	Underground installation of electrical conduit for the future track electrification. Equipment for this work includes: an excavator and packers.
Concrete Retaining Wall 14	March 2023	Approx. 2 Months	Day shift	The retaining wall is made up of reinforced concrete and backfilled with earth to ground elevation. Equipment for this work includes: an excavator, dump truck, and concrete trucks and pump.
Restoration	April 2023	Approx. 2 Months	Day Shift	Restoration of disturbed areas with topsoil, hyrdorseeding, final grading and tie-in works. Equipment for this work includes: Mini excavators, dump trucks, and water trucks.

Residents should expect some noise, vibration, dust, and site lighting. Work crews will take reasonable precautions to minimize disturbances to residents, including the following:

- No idling of non-essential equipment to reduce the accumulation of construction noise.
- Pointing lights away from residential windows.
- Noise vibration monitoring will be set up to ensure that noise levels are within exposure limits.

HOURS OF WORK

- Day shift work will occur between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. five (5) days per week (Monday to Friday).
- Night shift work will occur between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. five (5) days per week (Sunday to Thursday).
- Work may be rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC & PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- The corridor will be accessed via Kimridge Ave (at the south end of Mystic Ave), north of the rail corridor.
- Increased construction vehicles and equipment can be expected in the work area.
- Pedestrian access will be restricted on Kimridge Ave beginning May 2022. On lane will be closed during the Cast-in-Place Concrete Retaining Wall 10 construction activities and a detour will be put into place until this work is completed.

TRANSIT INFORMATION

• No impacts to TTC or other public transit modes are anticipated during this work.
