

Lane closures in the Kipling area adjusting in September 2022


The Eglinton Crosstown West Extension (ECWE) is one of four new subway projects that will transform transit in our region; getting hundreds of thousands of people where they need to be better, faster and easier than today.

KIPLING HEADWALL PROGRESS


In May, WECC began construction of the headwalls at the intersection of Kipling Avenue. Headwalls are underground support structures that create the frame for future subway stations and emergency exit buildings. This work will continue in the Kipling area until anticipated completion in Spring 2023.

WHAT WORK IS HAPPENING?

In mid-September, crews will be adjusting the position of open traffic lanes at Kipling Ave. to the north and south sides of Eglinton Avenue West, as shown below:



In October, crews will then adjust the position of open traffic lanes to the south, as shown below:



During this work:

Traffic maps not to scale.

- Two lanes (one eastbound and one westbound) will continue to remain open to traffic during construction.
- Traffic will continue to make left and right traffic turns at the intersection.
- The 32A bus stop will be temporarily relocated approximately 100m to the east of the intersection.

EMERGENCY EXIT BUILDING CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES

WECC will continue constructing the first emergency exit building (EEB) at the corner of Wincott Drive and Eglinton Avenue West. EEBs provide both emergency outlets from the tunnels for passengers and emergency access for firefighters and emergency response teams. This work is expected to complete by Spring 2023.

During this work:

- Occasional closure of the most north lane on Eglinton Avenue West just east of Wincott Drive will be required. This closure will be day-of occurrences and is only required for safety purposes, equipment movement, or other temporary works.
- Later this year, long-term lane closures will be required to complete this work. Another notice with more details will be shared once the date of the closures has been confirmed.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Residents can expect to hear noise from equipment, such as drilling, compaction equipment, hauling trucks, excavators, dozers and generators. We are working as quickly as possible to minimize the impact to the neighborhoods. Mitigations are being put in place to reduce dust impacts, including the use of water sprays and biodegradable dust suppressants.

HOURS OF WORK

- Construction crews will work Monday to Friday between the hours of **7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m.** Weekend work may be required on occasion.

TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN IMPACTS

- Pedestrian detours may be required to ensure safe work sites and the safety of those travelling through the area. WECC is working closely with Metrolinx and the City of Toronto to ensure the impact to pedestrians and cyclists is as minimal as possible during this construction.
- If additional pedestrian details or bus stop changes are required, a separate notice will be issued to keep the public informed.

The information provided above is anticipated based on the current construction schedule and is subject to change.
