Detour: Left Turns and Straight Through from the Highway 401 West/London Bound Off Ramp at Hurontario Street Prohibited for LRT Construction

What work is taking place?

Important work to install tracks along Hurontario Street continues at the 401 interchange and will occur in two consecutive stages, lasting approximately 8 weeks in total. This work is scheduled to begin **Thursday April 20**, **2023 at 10pm, to Monday May 15, 2023 at 10pm.** It requires left-turn restrictions at 401 Westbound Exit at Hurontario Street. Crews will be excavating the centre of the intersection to install tracks and pour concrete, enabling the guideway to move through intersections along Hurontario Street. Construction will be 24 hours per day, seven days per week, meaning that the turning restrictions and detours will remain in place until this stage of construction is completed. To minimize congestion, two lanes of traffic will be maintained in each direction along Hurontario Street and access to emergency vehicles will always permitted.

What is closed?

Once this work begins, left turns and straight through to Madill Boulevard from the west/London bound off ramp will be prohibited.

Is there a detour?

Instead of turning left or going straight, drivers will turn right and use Annagem Boulevard, Edwards Boulevard, and World Drive to go southbound on Hurontario Street. For Madill Boulevard, drivers will use the same detour cross Hurontario Street to Capston Drive and turn left onto Kateson Drive.

Can I still turn right?

Right turns onto Hurontario Street will still be allowed.

TIMING

- Left turns and straight through to Madill Boulevard, from Highway 401 west/London bound will be prohibited between April 20, 2023 to May 15, 2023.
- Detours will be in place throughout the duration of the work.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Access to southbound Hurontario Street will be maintained through a detour route from Annagem Boulevard, Edwards Boulevard and World Drive.
- Access to Madill Boulevard will be maintained through a detour route from Annagem Boulevard, Edwards Boulevard, World Drive, Capston Drive, and Kateson Drive.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.
- Consider alternative routes and avoid using the Hurontario Interchange during this time.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRANSIT DETAILS

- MiWay will continue to operate with regular service.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.
