We acknowledge the historic and continued impacts of colonization and the need to work towards meaningful reconciliation with the original caretakers of this land.


We acknowledge that Metrolinx operates on territories and lands covered by many treaties that affirm and value the rights of Indigenous communities, Nations and Peoples.


WHAT ARE WE DOING

Kitchener GO Line Expansion


The Fourth Track Lansdowne to Black Creek project is a segment of work that is a part of the overall GO Expansion program. The realignment of the West Toronto Railpath will facilitate the new track to be installed and allow for more trains to be added to the Kitchener line. The Kitchener GO Line Expansion will bring all-day, two-way GO service for people across Toronto, Brampton and Kitchener.

Kitchener GO Rail Corridor and West Toronto Railpath from Lansdowne Ave to Dupont St







PROJECT OVERVIEW

- Construction of the Kitchener Fourth Track:
 - On-corridor Work (Metrolinx Kitchener Rail Corridor)
 - New track
 - Grading and drainage
 - Retaining walls, noise walls, high-security fencing
 - Off-corridor work (West Toronto Railpath):
 - Path realignment
 - Bloor St rail bridge shift
 - New Bloor GO tunnel and pavilion at Randolph Ave
 - New park at Ernest Ave
 - Landscaping (Trees, shrubs, furniture, etc)







WHAT TO EXPECT NEXT


- Utility Relocation at Randolph Ave
 - Underground utilities need to be relocated away from the new tunnel
 - Gas main
 - Watermain
 - Fire Hydrant
 - Hydro Pole
 - Electrical Transformer
 - May require temporary water service interruption. Randolph Ave residents and businesses will be notified beforehand.



WHAT TO EXPECT NEXT

Tunnel Shoring and Excavation

 Construction of the tunnel begins with shoring work. Concrete caissons will be drilled vertically around the perimeter of the tunnel to retain the earth during excavation.



 - Installation of steel posts, concrete and transparent panels



WHAT TO EXPECT NEXT


- Bloor St Rail Bridge Shift
 - Postponed to Spring 2023 due to industry-wide material supply issues
