

Road Closure of Matthews Gate at Hurontario Street

Monday July 17 to Saturday July 22, 2023

Works are scheduled to take place from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily.



What work is taking place?

Crews will be installing Alectra duct banks at the Matthews Gate near Hurontario Street from Monday July 17 to Saturday July 22, 2023. This work requires the closure of Matthews Gate on Monday, July 17 at 7a.m., reopening on Saturday, July 22 at 10 p.m. This work will take place from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily.

During the closure, access for Emergency Service Vehicles **will NOT be maintained**.

Please follow posted detour signs while navigating around the road closure. Detours routes include Hurontario Street, Burnhamthorpe Road and Kariya Drive, and Enfield Place.

Please note, work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. If you require the most up-to-date information, please reach out to peel@metrolinx.com and our team will provide you with e-updates of this work.

TIMING

- Matthews Gate closure is scheduled from July 17 to July 22, 2023
- Works are scheduled to take place from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
