
Traffic Signal Activation and Pole Removals at Eglinton Avenue and Lascelles Boulevard

What Work is Taking Place?

As early as Monday, June 5, 2023, crews at Avenue Station will begin activating the permanent traffic signals at Eglinton Avenue and Lascelles Boulevard. Once the traffic signals have been activated, crews will begin removals of the old traffic poles. To facilitate this work safely, periodic lane reductions may be in place at Eglinton Avenue and Lascelles Boulevard. Temporary pedestrian rerouting may be in effect. Pedestrians will be safely rerouted around the work zone. This work is expected to take place from Monday to Friday between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. for

Traffic barrels and fencing will be in place to delineate pedestrians from the work zones and traffic. Temporary pedestrian rerouting may be implemented. Noise from construction activity can be expected. Expect delays while travelling through the intersection.
