

Detour: Left Turns from East/Toronto bound Highway 401 at Hurontario Street Prohibited for LRT Construction

Tuesday August 15, 2023 at 10 p.m., to Tuesday September 11, 2023 at 10 p.m.



What work is taking place?

Crews will begin work to construct the LRT through the ramp intersections in the middle of Hurontario Street over Highway 401. This work will occur in two consecutive stages, lasting approximately 8 weeks in total. The first stage of this work is scheduled to begin **Tuesday August 15, 2023 at 10pm, to Tuesday September 11, 2023 at 10pm**. Construction will be continuous, meaning that the turning restrictions and detours will remain in place until this stage of construction is completed. To minimize congestion, two lanes of traffic will be maintained in each direction along Hurontario Street and access to emergency vehicles will always be permitted.

What is closed?

Once this work begins, left turns onto Hurontario Street from the Toronto bound off ramp will be prohibited.

Is there a detour?

Instead of turning left, drivers will take Whittle Road to Britannia Road where they can turn right onto Hurontario Street. Detour signs will identify the route. The traffic signals will also be adjusted to keep residents and businesses moving.

Can I still turn right? Can I exit on Whittle Road?

Right turns onto Hurontario Street and access to Whittle Road will still be allowed.

TIMING

- Left turns to Hurontario Street from Highway 401 east/Toronto bound will be closed between August 15, 2023 to September 11, 2023.
- Detours will be in place throughout the duration of the work.
- Bad weather may delay the start and/or completion of the work.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Access for left turning vehicles will be maintained with a detour using Whittle Road and Britannia Road.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.
- Consider alternative routes and avoid using the Hurontario Interchange during this time.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.

- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRANSIT DETAILS

- MiWay will continue to operate with regular service.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.
