
Access Road Construction on Dundas St E between West Ave and Logan Ave

Start date: As early as Monday, August 28, 2023 Schedule: Monday to Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Duration: Two weeks



What is happening?

- On Monday, August 28, 2023, crews will begin constructing an access road into the railway corridor from the work zone shown on the map.
- Construction activities will include excavation, concrete breaking, grading, paving, and clearing of vegetation and trees.
- Access road construction will take place Monday Friday between 7:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m. for approximately two (2) weeks. This access road will remain in operation through September 2024.

- Construction fencing will be installed within the Logan laneway, along the perimeter of the access road, and on the outside of the rail corridor between Dundas St E and Logan Ave
- The existing retaining wall will be demolished and removed.

Traffic and Pedestrian Details

- Vehicle and pedestrian access through the laneway at the north-west corner of Dundas St E and Logan Ave will be unavailable.
- The bike lane on the north side of Dundas St E will be closed between the Dundas St E bridge and Logan Ave. Westbound cyclists will need to share the road with vehicles while travelling through this area.
- The sidewalk on the north side of Dundas St E will be closed between the Dundas St E bridge and Logan Ave; the sidewalk on the south side of the street will remain open. Sidewalk closure signs will be in place.
- Sidewalks and bike lanes will reopen once the access road is completed.

What to Expect

- Clear signage will be posted to direct pedestrians and drivers.
- Traffic barrels, safety fencing and barricades will be in place to prevent drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians from entering work areas.
- Noise from construction activities including excavation, concrete breaking, saw cutting, grading, paving, drilling, and material loading can be expected.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zones.
- Traffic control personnel will be present to coordinate the safe movement of vehicles and ensure pedestrian safety.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- The Ontario Line will be a 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- The line will bring 15 new stations to the city and will run from Exhibition Place, through downtown, all the way to the Eglinton Crosstown LRT at Don Mills Road and Eglinton Avenue East.
- It will accommodate nearly 400,000 daily trips and provide significant relief from crowding throughout the existing transit network thanks to connections to more than 40 other subway, GO train, LRT, streetcar, and bus routes.
