

## LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT


## **SAFETY MOMENT**

#### **Pedestrian Safety**

- Demolition and construction activities often result in sidewalk closures and diversions.
- Temporary walkways are put in place to allow safe mobility around construction zones.
- Temporary walkways must be clearly marked to allow for safe mobility.
- Stay safe! Please obey and follow all posted signs around construction areas.

388,000 daily boardings




### **STATION AREA MAP**


- Station entrances are placed a few steps away from streetcar stops.
- One station is located on the northeast corner of the King/Bathurst intersection.
- One station is located on the southeast corner of the King/Bathurst intersection.
- Customers will be able to walk directly from subway platform to their preferred streetcar.



## **CURRENT ACTIVITIES**

 Site preparation, in anticipation of building demolition, including interior works, utilities relocations, permitting, surveying, fencing and scaffolding





### **CURRENT ACTIVITIES - FENCING + OVERHEAD SCAFFOLDING**

- Fence Installation to prepare the site for upcoming demolition activities
- Temporary metal fencing will be installed at both sites
- Overhead scaffolding installed in some sections to protect pedestrians
- Pedestrian walkways will be moved to laneway to accommodate demolition footprint




## **UPCOMING ACTIVITY: DEMOLITION**

- **Demolition activities planned** to begin early August
- Buildings include 662, 668, 663-665, 647 King St West and 60 Stewart St
- Expected duration is up to five (5) months
- Expected work hours weekdays 6 a.m. to 7 a.m. construction team set up and construction demolition will begin at 7 a.m. until 6 p.m.

## **MITIGATION OF NOISE AND DUST**

## **Mitigation of noise**

Measures in place to limit noise and dust on-site, including:

- Minimal use of the excavator to limit noise on sites.
- Dust mitigation procedure will be spraying water on elements being removed and the excavator attachments to suppress excess amounts of dust.
- Daily cleaning of the road pavement and sidewalks for the entire frontage of the property adjacent to demolition area and laneway access up to 20 meters from the property.

## **UPCOMING ACTIVITIES - HERITAGE WORKS**

- South site heritage work planned to begin at 663-665 King Street West this month
- Front facing façade on King Street West to be retained in place, supports will be added during demolition phase
- West-facing façade will be dismantled and salvaged




## **UPCOMING ACTIVITIES - HERITAGE WORKS**

- On the north site, heritage work planned to begin at 662 and 668 King Street West this month
- Building façades to be panelized and salvaged during demolition



### **HERITAGE WORKS**

- Demolitions are based on preserving the heritage facades.
- Use of both mechanical equipment and handheld equipment.
- Mechanical equipment will be for larger sections using an excavator with different attachments.
- To preserve heritage facades there will be handheld equipment for a more precise removal.



### **UPCOMING ACTIVITIES - TTC STOP RELOCATION**

- Two TTC stops to be relocated
- Existing 4156 TTC Stop (504 Streetcar and 304 King Bus) to move east
- Existing 15650 TTC Stop (504 Streetcar and 304 King Bus) to move east Legend






Relocated TTC stop (504 Streetcar and 304 King Bus)



## **UPCOMING ACTIVITIES - TREES**

- Six trees to be removed within demolition footprint
- Four trees to be preserved within demolition footprint
- Work to expected to begin as early as August 10<sup>th</sup>
- Inspection for birds and nests will begin August 10th
- Tree cutting and removal will begin August 11th and will take up to 48 hours.
- Future landscape plan to include planting of new trees
