
Overnight sewer and utility surveying near **Queen Street West and University Avenue**

Expected Start Date: As early as September 5, 2023 **Expected End Date:** Up to November 30, 2023 **Planned work hours:** Overnight 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.



What is happening?

- Construction crews will be surveying utilities and conducting sewer inspections in the areas shown in yellow on the map above.
- Crews will move around within the locations shown on the map as each site will take one or two nights to complete the work.
- Temporary lane closures are required for crews to safely carry out the survey work.
- The work is done by accessing sewer manholes to assess internal conditions of sewers and cabling before station construction begins.
- Crews will drill into the road to inspect utilities under the roadway. Once complete, the drill areas will be restored.
- Equipment such as a saw cutter and a hydrovac truck will be used.

What to expect

- There will be intermittent closures north and southbound on University Avenue and Simcoe Street, while crews set up and survey in that area.
- Portions of bike lanes along Simcoe Street and University Avenue will be temporarily closed during overnight work in impacted areas and bicycles will merge with traffic.
- All pedestrian access will be maintained in both directions using walkways where sidewalks are temporarily closed.
- Where required, barriers will separate the pedestrian area from active traffic lanes.

- Access to the existing TTC station entrance will be maintained.
- A traffic control person will be at each closure guiding traffic.
- Residents will hear noise from work equipment.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
