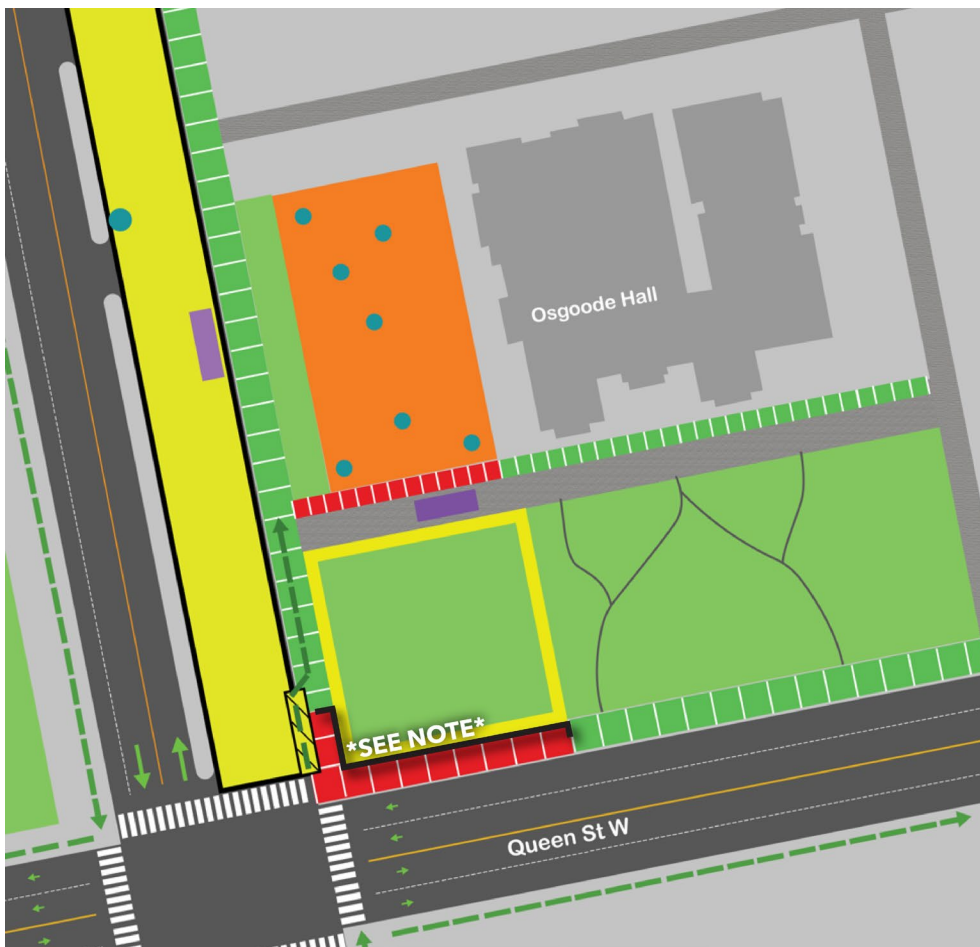











# Investigative works at Osgoode Hall

**Expected start date:** As early as October 1, 2023

**Expected completion:** Up to 15 days

**Hours of work:** Overnight from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.

## What is happening?

- In preparation for construction activities at the future Osgoode Station, crews will be conducting investigative works of underground utilities and the irrigation system in the Osgoode Hall’s westside park.
- This work requires crews to dig eight holes the in the areas defined in the graphic, using both manual methods and a vacuum truck.
- The work will occur overnight from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. in order to avoid impacting court operations.

## What to expect

- This is a short-term process. Crews will look for underground utilities and the irrigation system by digging test holes. The method for digging depends on the anticipated utilities in the ground.
- More than one test hole may be required to properly identify what is underground.
- Two vacuum trucks used to assist with digging will be parked adjacent to the work zone.
- Crews will set up nightly for work. They will not remain in place during the day.
- The sidewalk that is closed during the nightly works will be reopened during the day.
- Once the survey is completed, the holes will be filled.
- Those nearby can expect to hear noise from the vacuum trucks and can expect to see pylons and cones surrounding the trucks parked to support the work.
- Work may be delayed, rescheduled or extended due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
