
Overnight weekend construction in the Don Yard

Starting Friday, October 13 at 10 p.m. until Tuesday, October 17 2023 at 5 a.m.



What is happening?

- Continuous overnight weekend work will take place in the Don Yard starting at 10 p.m. on Friday, October 13 until 5 a.m. on Tuesday, October 17, 2023.
- Construction activities will include excavation, grading, electrical installations, track realignment, track installation, signal relocations and testing and commissioning.
- The Lakeshore East GO rail corridor needs to be closed to safely complete this work. GO
 train service will be affected. For more information, please review the Transit Information
 section below.
- Work will be executed on a 24-hour basis to ensure that all necessary construction activities are completed when trains are not running.

What to expect

- Noise from construction equipment including a hydro-vacuum truck, excavator, lift, tamper, loaders, track equipment, crane, and grading equipment (trucks).
- A hydro-vacuum truck will be required to safely carry out some work due to the limited space between the construction area and the existing buried utilities.

- Crews must use hydro-vac equipment when working within two meters of buried utilities to ensure public and worker safety and protect the utilities from damage.
- Trucks will enter and exit the site via Lakeshore Boulevard east of Cherry Street.
- Noise mitigation measures will be implemented as required during the day and overnight.
- The existing train tracks and signals will be realigned to make way for Ontario Line construction.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Transit Information

- There will be no GO train service on the Lakeshore East Line starting the evening of Friday, October 13 until the end of service on Sunday October 15, 2023.
- On Monday, October 16, 2023, train service will only be offered between Durham College Oshawa GO to Danforth GO stations. There will be no GO train service to Union Station.
- Buses will replace some train services during this time. For more information on GO service impacts, please visit the **GO website**.

About the Ontario Line
