Since completion of the Environmental Project Report (EPR) in 2011, Metrolinx has advanced the design of the Bowmanville Rail Service Extension project – including changes to the proposed layover facility and potential GO station locations, track alignment, the addition of new bridges, bridge replacements and bridge expansions to accommodate the proposed new tracks. Due to the significant changes since the initial EPR, an Addendum to the EPR is required and is almost ready for review and comment.

There will be a Virtual Public Information Centre (PIC) open from June 8 to June 21, 2023, to present and seek feedback on the results of the technical studies, including potential impacts and proposed mitigation measures. The materials will be made available for review on June 8, 2023 on the following <u>webpage</u>. During the Virtual PIC period, the public may submit any questions or feedback via the Slido form at the bottom of the <u>webpage</u> or by email to our community inbox at <u>DurhamRegion@metrolinx.com</u>.

There will also be a live Virtual Open House (VOH) on Wednesday, June 14, 2023 from 6:30-8:00pm during which the project team will be on hand to answer questions about the project, submitted in advance or during the event via Slido (available <u>here</u>). 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### Bowmanville Extension EPR Addendum Public Information Stakeholder Package

#### Key Messages

Metrolinx has been making progress on the design for the Bowmanville Extension project to bring two-way, all-day rail service from Oshawa to Bowmanville. This work has required an update to environmental studies through an addendum to the Environmental Project Report.

This EPR addendum is ready for review, and materials will be available online for public review and comment from June 8<sup>th</sup> to June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023, with a live virtual open house on Wednesday, June 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023, from 6:30-8:00pm. ### <u>Q&A</u>

#### Project (General)

#### What progress has been made on the Bowmanville Extension Project?

In the <u>Initial Business Case (IBC)</u>, completed in February 2020, Metrolinx narrowed the field of four routing options to just one. The preferred option focuses on the route that uses Canadian Pacific (CP) Railway's existing alignment north of highway 401 through to Bowmanville.

Metrolinx has advanced the future service plan for the Bowmanville Extension Project through the <u>Preliminary Design Business Case (PDBC)</u> which was published in early 2022.

Metrolinx is also progressing through the procurement process required to deliver all the required rail infrastructure to bring GO train service to Bowmanville.

#### Why was an addendum needed to the original Environmental Assessment?

Since completion of the EPR in 2011, Metrolinx has advanced the design of the Bowmanville Extension project - including changes to the proposed layover facility and GO station locations, track alignment, the addition of new bridges, bridge replacements and the modification of existing bridges to accommodate the proposed new tracks.

The TPAP Addendum is a time-regulated assessment process where potential environmental impacts of a preferred design for the project are evaluated through field work and modelling. Proposed solutions to eliminate or reduce the effect of those impacts are outlined, and the information is documented in the EPR Addendum for the project.

There will be a public information centre as part of the TPAP held June 8<sup>th</sup> to June 21<sup>st</sup>.

# What can I do if I have concerns with some of the environmental impacts in the materials for the EPR Addendum or have additional feedback?

Materials will be available online for review and comment from June 8<sup>th</sup> to June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023. Comments and concerns can be brought forward through this as well as during the virtual open house taking place on June 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023 from 6:30-8:00 p.m. which can be registered for <u>here</u>.

#### What funding has the Provincial government committed to for this project?

As part of the 2022 Budget, the Province committed to advance work to extend GO Rail Transit from Oshawa to Bowmanville.

Metrolinx continues to explore opportunities for third parties to deliver the four stations along the Bowmanville Extension.

#### What are the benefits of the Bowmanville Extension Project?

By extending the Lakeshore East Line to Bowmanville through fast, frequent rail, Metrolinx is delivering on its promise to connect more people to jobs and businesses, improve transit travel times, and increase travel options in Durham Region.

By 2041, the Bowmanville Extension Project will connect 19,000 residents and 10,400 jobs along the extension.

The project is forecasted to attract 4.9 million annual boardings by 2041 and reduce transport emissions by attracting auto-users to the rail network.

#### What service levels are being proposed in the PDBC?

The <u>Preliminary Design Business Case (PDBC)</u> recommends moving forward to the procurement and construction phase, which will bring two-way, all-day rail service to Bowmanville.

Once required infrastructure is complete, customers will benefit from express peak service every half an hour operating express between Union Station and Pickering GO Station and making all stops between Pickering and Bowmanville.

In the off-peak, GO trains will travel hourly making all stops between Bowmanville and Union Station. Weekend service will be every two hours making all stops between Bowmanville and Union Station.

The expanded service will reduce commuters in-vehicle travel time an average of 15 minutes from Bowmanville to Union Station.
