
Dundas Street East weekend road closure for bridge reconstruction

Dundas Street East Weekend Road Closure: Friday October 13 at 11 p.m. until Monday October 16, 2023 at 4 a.m.



What is happening?

- Starting on Friday October 13 at 11 p.m. until Monday October 16, 2023, at 4 a.m. Dundas Street East will be closed beneath the rail bridge to demolish and remove a section of the bridge deck.
- Construction activities will include concrete breaking, saw cutting, torch cutting, and material removals.
- Dundas Street East must be closed to complete this work safely.
- The Lakeshore East rail corridor will be closed on this weekend to complete various works at the Dundas St., Logan Ave. and Queen St. E. bridges.
- Overnight work will be required to ensure all activities are completed during the rail corridor and road closure period. Less disruptive works will be performed overnight to mitigate noise disturbances. Construction mitigation measures will be implemented throughout the works to minimize community impacts. Construction Mitigations

There will be periods of significant noise during the day due to the nature of the work (concrete breaking). Several mitigations will be implemented to reduce community disruption during the demolition of the Dundas St E bridge deck:

- No overnight breaking: Concrete breaking will be restricted during the overnight period (11 p.m. 7 a.m.)
- Noise barriers: Noise barriers will be installed between the work site and the residences adjacent to the work.
- **Noise reducing equipment:** Machinery will be equipped with broadband vehicle back-up alarms and baffles to reduce noise from moving equipment and engines.
- Noise monitoring: Locating noise monitors closer to residences.
- Worker parking: Mandatory worker parking at 10 Dickens St. No worker parking in the neighbourhood.
- Good neighbour practices: Reinforcing good neighbour behaviours with the workers before each shift.
- 24-hour hotline: A 24/7 hotline (416-202-5100) is in place to address noise complaints and other issues.



What to expect

- Excavators, saws, jack hammers, loaders, torches, dump trucks, and hand tools will be used to facilitate the demolition works at Dundas Street East bridge.
- Expect noise from the construction equipment mentioned above.
- Clear signage will be in place to direct vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists.
- Traffic barrels, fencing, and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.
- Site lighting will be positioned downward into the rail corridor and away from residential properties.
- Construction equipment and materials will be property secured within work zones.
- Work may be delayed due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Traffic and pedestrian details

- No traffic, pedestrian, or cyclist access will be permitted beneath the Dundas Street East bridge.
- Access for residents and businesses (local traffic) will be maintained east of Broadview Avenue and west of Logan Avenue.
- Signage indicating that Dundas Street East is closed except for local traffic will be posted at Broadview Avenue and Logan Avenue to direct drivers.
- Traffic will be diverted both way via Broadview Ave., Queen St. E., Logan Ave. and Carlaw Ave.
- Cyclists will be diverted both ways via Boulton Ave., Degrassi St., First Ave., Gerrard St. E., and Logan Ave.
- Advance signage will be in place to notify drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists of the closure.

Transit information

- There will be no GO train service on the Lakeshore East Line starting the evening of Friday, October 13 until the end of service on Sunday October 15, 2023.
- Buses will replace some train services during this time. For more information on GO service impacts, please visit the <u>GO website</u>.
- On Monday, October 16, 2023, train service will only be offered between Durham College Oshawa GO to Danforth GO stations. There will be no train service to Union Station.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
