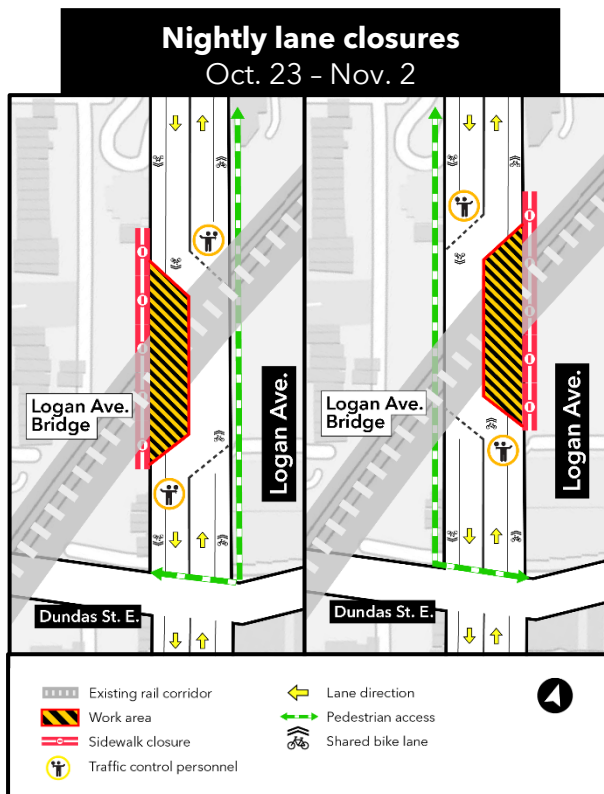


Update: Logan Avenue overnight weekend road closure for bridge reconstruction

Overnight work: Starting Monday October 23, 2023 for approximately two (2) weeks

Logan Avenue weekend road closure: Friday November 3 at 7 p.m. until Monday November 6, 2023 at 7 a.m.



What is happening?

Preparation work:

- This is an update to the construction notice provided on Sept. 6, 2023. Please note changes to the construction dates and times.
- Starting as early as Monday, October 23, 2023, overnight construction work will take place at the Logan Avenue bridge to prepare for the demolition of the bridge deck.

- Saws will be used to pre-cut a section of the concrete on the bridge deck. The concrete needs to be cut into smaller pieces before it is demolished to maintain the structural integrity and safety of the bridge.
- This work will take place Monday - Friday between 8 p.m. - 4 a.m. for approximately two (2) weeks; overnight weekend work may be required as a contingency if all activities cannot be completed during the weekdays. Noise mitigations will be implemented as required (see details below).
- During this work, one traffic lane and one sidewalk will be closed beneath the bridge to ensure public safety. Please review the "Traffic and pedestrian details" section below for specific information.

Bridge demolition:

- Starting on Friday, November 3, 2023, at 7 p.m. until Monday November 6, 2023, at 7 a.m., Logan Avenue will be closed beneath the rail bridge to demolish and remove a section of the bridge deck.
- Construction activities will include concrete breaking, saw cutting, torch cutting, and material removals.
- Logan Avenue must be closed to complete this work safely.

Construction Mitigations

There will be periods of significant noise during the day due to the nature of the work (concrete breaking). Several mitigations will be implemented to reduce community disruption during the demolition of the Logan Avenue bridge deck:

- **No overnight breaking:** Concrete breaking will be restricted during the overnight period (11 p.m. - 7 a.m.)
- **Noise barriers:** Noise barriers will be installed between the work site and the residences adjacent to the work.
- **Noise reducing equipment:** Machinery will be equipped with broadband vehicle back-up alarms and baffles to reduce noise from moving equipment and engines.
- **Noise monitoring:** Locating noise monitors closer to residences.
- **Worker parking:** Mandatory worker parking at 10 Dickens St. No worker parking in the neighbourhood.
- **Good neighbour practices:** Reinforcing good neighbour behaviours with the workers before each shift.
- **24-hour hotline:** A 24/7 hotline (416-202-5100) is in place to address noise complaints and other issues.

What to expect

- A saw cutter will be used to complete the preparation works.
- A mini excavator, jack hammer, loader, torch, dump trucks, and hand tools will be used to facilitate the demolition works at Logan Avenue bridge.
- Expect noise from the construction equipment mentioned above.
- Clear signage will be in place to direct vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists.
- Traffic barrels, fencing, and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.

- Site lighting will be positioned downward into the rail corridor and away from residential properties.
- Clear signage will be posted to direct pedestrians and drivers, including lane reduction signage.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within work zones.
- Work may be delayed due to inclement weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

Why overnight?

- Preparation works will take place at night to minimize traffic delays and impacts to the travelling public.
- Bridge demolition works will take place on a 24-hour basis to ensure all necessary activities are completed during the weekend road closure.
- It is not safe for construction crews to parts of this work while trains are active and running in the rail corridor during the day.
- Noise mitigation measures will be implemented during this work as required. Further details are provided in the Construction Mitigations section above.

Traffic and pedestrian details

Nightly lane closures:

- Monday - Friday between 8 p.m. - 4 a.m. for approximately two (2) weeks
- Traffic on Logan Avenue will be reduced to one lane only with traffic alternating in each direction.
- Alternating sidewalk closures will be in place on the east and west sides of Logan Avenue between immediately under the Logan Avenue bridge. Pedestrians will need to cross at Dundas Street and First Avenue.
- The bike lanes on the east and west sides of Logan Avenue will be closed during this work.
- Northbound and southbound cyclists will need to share the road with vehicles while travelling through this area. Share the road signs will be posted to guide cyclists.
- **Traffic lanes, sidewalks and bike lanes will only be closed at night and will reopen during the day after each night of work.**

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- Traffic control personnel and/or a paid duty office will be present to direct traffic and pedestrians.
- Traffic lanes will shift to the east and west sides of the street as work progresses from one end of the bridge to the other.
- Drivers are reminded to slow down and allow cyclists to safely merge into the traffic lane. Do not attempt to pass cyclists.

Logan Avenue road closure:

- From Friday November 3 at 7 p.m. until Monday November 6, 2023, at 7 a.m., no traffic, pedestrian, or cyclist access will be permitted beneath the Logan Avenue bridge.
- Access for residents and businesses (local traffic) will be maintained north of Dundas Street East and south of Gerrard Street East.
- Advanced signage will be in place at Dundas Street East and Gerrard Street East. to notify drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists that Logan Avenue is closed except for local traffic at Dundas Street East and Gerrard Street East.
- Traffic will be diverted both way via Dundas St. E., Carlaw Ave., and Gerrard St. E.
- Cyclists will be diverted both ways via Dundas St. E., Carlaw Ave., and Gerrard St. E.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 40 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.

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
