
Temporary sidewalk and lane closure on King Street West

Expected start date: Thursday, October 26, 2023 **Expected end date:** Thursday, October 26, 2023

Hours of work: 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.



What is happening?

- Work crews will be removing the existing concrete curb to install tactile plates for accessibility at 642 King Street West between Bathurst Street and Portland Street. The affected area shown in yellow on the map above.
- The work is expected to be completed during one six-hour work period.
- Crews will be using saws to cut and remove existing concrete, as well as pouring concrete to refinish the sidewalk.

When will work begin and how will it affect me?

- Work is scheduled to begin on October 26, 2023, and be completed in one day, between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.
- Crews may arrive on site prior to 9 a.m. to set up equipment.
- The eastbound curb lane on King Street West between Bathurst Street and Portland Street will be partially closed to complete this work safely.
- The north sidewalk on King Street West between Bathurst Street and Portland Street will be temporarily reduced while work is completed. Pedestrian passage will be maintained with the use of barriers to separate pedestrians from active work zones.
- The existing King Street West streetcar stop, which is currently west of the construction zone, will be temporarily relocated east of the construction zone. The stop will return to its original location once work is complete.
- Signage will be posted advising pedestrians and motorists of the sidewalk and lane restrictions, as well as the temporary relocation of the TTC transit stop.
- Access to local residential and commercial units will be maintained.

What can I expect?

- Residents can expect to hear some noise from the work equipment, specifically saws to cut concrete and concrete trucks.
- Transit services will be maintained at all times.
- The lane and sidewalk closures and relocation of the TTC transit stop will be temporary while work is underway.
- Equipment will be cleared once all work is completed.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
