
Pier reconstruction at Dundas Street East Bridge

Expected start date: Monday, November 13, 2023


Expected duration: Five (5) weeks

Hours of work: Monday to Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.



What is happening?

- As early as Monday, November 13, 2023, crews will begin to remove and rebuild the centre piers at the Dundas Street East bridge.
- This work will take place during weekdays, Friday to Monday, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. for approximately five (5) weeks.
- Temporary bike lane closures and traffic lane reductions will be required to safely perform these activities; please refer to the traffic and pedestrian details below for specific information.





Traffic and pedestrian details

- The bike lanes on north and south sides of Dundas Street East will be closed during this work. Eastbound and westbound cyclists will need to share the road with vehicles while travelling through this area. Share the road signs will be posted to guide cyclists.
- Eastbound and westbound traffic on Dundas Street East will shift to the outer lanes to allow work to take place in the centre of the road. One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained on Dundas Street East.
- Motorists are reminded to slow down and allow cyclists to safely merge into the traffic lane. Do not attempt to pass cyclists.
- The sidewalk on the north and south sides of Dundas Street East will remain open; no pedestrian impacts are expected as a result of this work.

What to expect

- The existing centre piers at Dundas Street East bridge will be removed and new piers constructed.
- To complete this work safely, a work zone will be set up in the middle of Dundas Street East beneath the rail bridge.
- Construction activities will include concrete breaking (demolition), hauling, saw cutting, drilling, formwork installations, and concrete pours.
- Noise from construction equipment including trucks, excavators, jack hammers, saws, and loaders can be expected.
- Clear signage will be in place to direct vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists.
- Traffic barrels, fencing, and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zones.
- New traffic markings will be painted on the roadway to guide motorists and cyclists.
 Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 40 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
