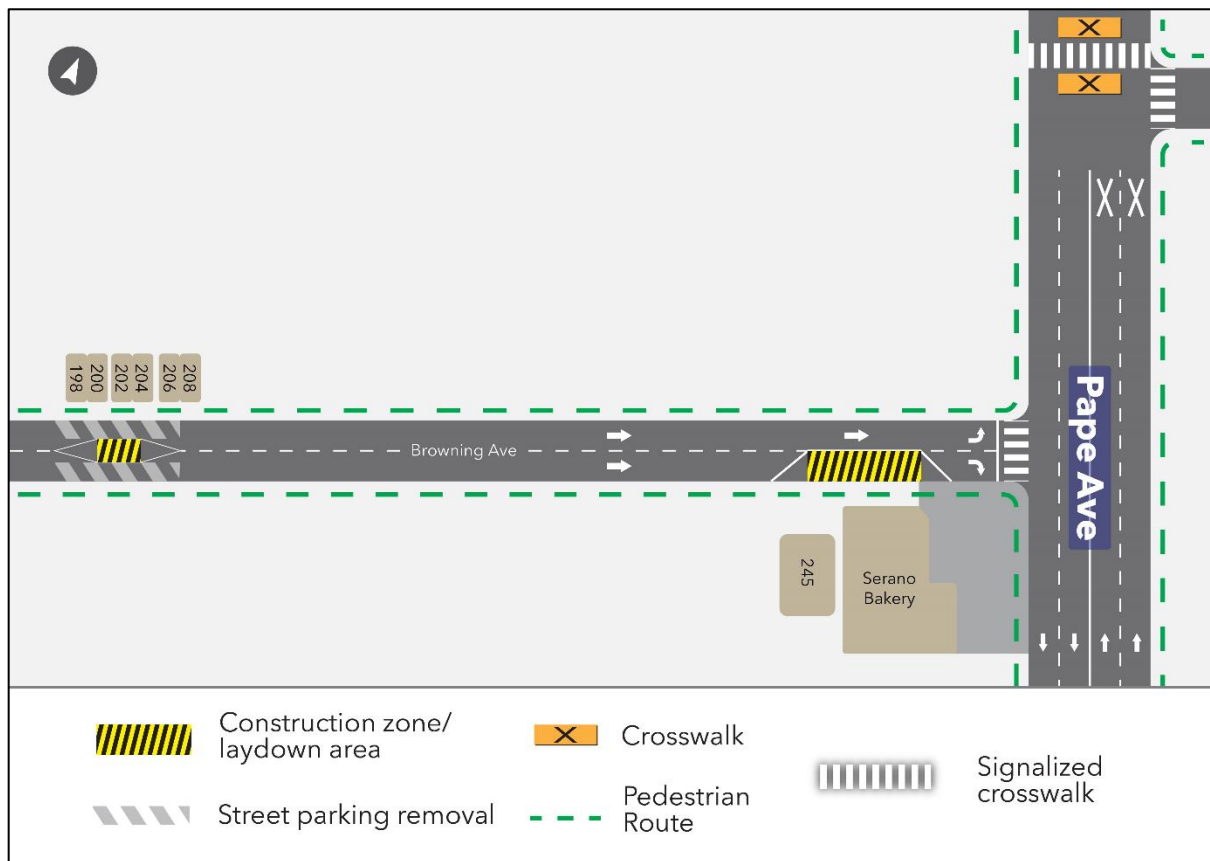


Ground-Water Level Monitoring at Browning Ave.

Expected start date: November 10, 2023

Expected duration: Work will take place periodically until December 15, 2023

Hours of work: Monday - Sunday between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., with eight days of 24-hour work



What is happening?

- A Metrolinx contractor will be completing ground water level monitoring starting on November 10, 2023, until December 15th, 2023.
 - All preparation, mobilization, and demobilization work will be completed between 7 AM to 7 PM, Monday to Friday.
 - Two periods of 24-hour work (each four days in duration) will be completed between November 10, 2023, and December 15th, 2023. This work requires clear and dry weather conditions; therefore, the dates are subject to change and work may be re-scheduled with minimal notice.

- This work will include on-site testing to support the design and construction of the Ontario Line.
- Construction equipment including trucks, quiet generators, pick-up trucks, and hand tools will be required to complete this work.

What to expect

- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear some minimal noise caused by trucks and other construction equipment.
- Work near 202 Browning Ave. will require a 24-hour lane reduction and approximately 5-10 parking spaces will be blocked off to permit the lane alterations.
- Through access will be provided at 3.5 meters and no driveways will be blocked.
- The traffic set-up at 241 Browning Ave. will be set up and torn down between the on-site four day work periods.
- The traffic set-up at 202 Browning Ave. will remain in place from November 10th, 2023, to December 15th, 2023.
- During the on-site testing, residents can expect to see a 3"- 4" diameter hose that will travel along the south grass boulevard connecting the two work zones. Adequate signage and traffic setups will be in place.
- A paid duty officer and flag person will be on-site throughout the duration of the work to maintain safety with pedestrian and vehicle traffic through the area.
- Pylons and barricades will be set up to provide barriers between pedestrians, cyclists, and traffic.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the Ontario Line

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar, and bus lines.
- Less than 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
