# Fall 2023 Construction Update: Lakeshore East rail corridor

Work schedule: Weekdays 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with select periods of weekend and overnight work



### What is happening?

Construction work is underway in the Lakeshore East rail corridor to prepare for the future Ontario Line. Major bridge demolition work, utility upgrades, and track relocations have been completed over the past two months .

The table below provides an update on the construction activities taking place in the rail corridor through winter 2024:

\* The activities listed above will take place within the rail corridor; no traffic or pedestrian impacts are expected. This work may be rescheduled due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.

#### Hours of work

- Daytime work is expected to take place Monday to Friday between 7 a.m. 7 p.m.
- Overnight work is expected to take place periodically Sunday Friday between 8 p.m. 5 a.m.
- Occasional daytime work may occur on Saturdays to complete critical activities.
- Work within the Lakeshore East rail corridor will continue through December 2025 to upgrade the existing GO rail infrastructure in preparation for Ontario Line station construction.

#### What to Expect

- Noise from construction equipment mentioned above can be expected.
- Noise mitigation measures will be implemented during the day and overnight as needed.
- Individual notices will be issued when construction work impacts traffic, pedestrians or requires disruptions to TTC or GO Train services.
- Overnight site lighting will be positioned downward into the rail corridor and away from residential properties.
- Construction equipment and materials will be secured within the work zones.

#### Work outside of the rail corridor:

Utility installations and reconstruction of the GO rail bridges at Queen St. E., Logan Ave., and Dundas St. E. will also continue through late winter 2024. Some work will require road, sidewalk, TTC and GO rail closures. Additional notices will be issued for these activities before work takes place.

#### About the Ontario Line

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 transit connections, including GO, TTC, and more.
- Approximately 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
