

Land Acknowledgment



Let us take a moment to acknowledge we are on lands that have been, and continue to be, home to many Indigenous Peoples including the Anishnabeg, the Haudenosaunee and the Huron-Wendat peoples.

SAFETY

Be ready for winter with the right tires and emergency kit

1. Winter Tires are Designed for Cold Weather

If you're a driver, it's important to ensure your vehicle is safe during snow, slush and ice season. Clear ice and snow from your windshield and mirrors. Make sure your car is equipped with winter tires; they're specifically designed and engineered for use in cold temperatures (7 C or lower), so they can physically spread out (the treads) and keep a better grip to the road.

2. Winter Driving Throws Hazards at You.

Winter weather can change in a hurry, if it's snow, ice or whiteout conditions, you should be "ready for any moment". Keep a safe distance and keep your eyes on the road.

3. Ensure you're ready for an Emergency.

Gloves, hats, phone battery charger pack, a blanket, first aid, hand and feet warmers and emergency pilons stored in your trunk can come in handy in case of a roadside pullover or emergency.

4. When in Doubt, Take Transit or Stay Home

If you're not confident in your winter driving ability, don't leave it to chance. Take transit or stay home.



Advanced Works



Advanced Work Update

- Progress continues with the sewer work on Queen Street West.
 Watermain work is expected to start mid November 2023 and
 will continue into December 2023. This work will take place at
 night to avoid sidewalk and pedestrian impacts.
- Sewer and watermain work is currently underway. Crews are working day and night shifts to accelerate the completion date.
- Clearway is currently working on installing new telecom utilities and a sewer bypass system across Yonge Street at the intersection Of Queen Street, work is expected to be completed by December 2023.
- OTG is on site conducting utility and pre-construction work ahead of transitioning to the Queen site.




HBC Basement and Hydro Vault Modifications

- Crews continue working to relocate existing underground hydro vaults including access modifications at street level, as well as basement modifications within the HBC building.
- Work is taking place above and below ground and is expected to be completed in Q1 2024.
- Street-level vault relocation work has begun requiring a portion of Queen Street to be closed from west of Hudson's Bay entrance and in front of Hudson's Bay store front.
- Pedestrian access has been maintained via the closed Queen Street roadway (see graphic on next slide).




Queen Street Pedestrian and Traffic Impacts - Current state



Queen Street - Signage and Housekeeping

- Fence banner signage near Bay and Queen was temporarily removed to accommodate the City's Remembrance Day signage.
- Graffiti on Metrolinx project signage cannot be cleaned, as such, all tagged banners have been removed.
- Metrolinx Communications team is planning to install updated wayfinding and project signage to accommodate the new fencing configuration, as well as options for using different sign material with antigraffiti coating
- Graffiti removal efforts for jersey barriers are ongoing as necessary.




Signage configuration as of October 2023.

York Street Track Construction



York Street Track Construction | Began October 2023


- The City of Toronto, TTC and Metrolinx are proceeding with the construction of the 501 Queen streetcar diversion.
- Metrolinx is delivering roadway and utility work to facilitate the Queen streetcar detour on York St. from Queen St. W. intersection to north of Adelaide St. W. intersection.
- City of Toronto is delivering track, roadway and utility work for the Adelaide St. portion. Work is well underway.





York Street | Stage 1

- The York Street project will be conducted in four stages, Stage 1 is currently underway (see map)
- This stage is expected to take approximately 8-12 weeks to complete
- One westbound traffic lane will remain open on Richmond Street at the intersection of York Street and Richmond Street.
- A paid duty officer will be on-site 24/7 to safely direct traffic.
- Local traffic will be permitted to make a lefthand turn onto York Street from Richmond Street to access parking and laneways.
- A U-turn along York Street south of Richmond will be allowed through the facilitation of a paid duty officer.

Investigative utilities testing at 1 Queen Street East + Victoria Street


Expected Start Date: OTG coordinating

- Test is performed by dropping dye in a drain in the patio of 1 Queen Street East and conducting a visual inspection in a manhole in Victoria Street.
- This test is expected to confirm assumptions of the connection of different pipes in the area.
- Manholes will be closed as soon as the work is completed.






