
Manse Road Rail Crossing: Whistle Blowing Commencement

Safet is our Number One Priority

Safety of communities, passengers and operators on our network is our highest priority. Bells and whistles are used for safety purposes to alert people of oncoming trains. On rail corridors that are Metrolinx-owned, our key role is to review and confirm that rail crossings are in compliance with the requirements allow trains to pass through without blowing their whistles (known as whistle cessation).

During a safety review at a Metrolinx-owned level crossing on Manse Road in the City of Toronto, Metrolinx noted several changes that are required to increase the safety in this area. Therefore, until those improvements are made, every train passing through the Manse Road rail crossing will be required to blow their whistle leading up to and through this crossing from both directions as indicated in the image above.

Even when whistles have not been deployed at a level crossing, rail operators like Metrolinx may reinstate whistling if the safety conditions for whistle cessation are no longer being maintained. Train operators are also required to use train horns for safety reasons such as animals, weather, trespassers, construction crews or any other potential safety concerns within the Right of Way.



We do seek to limit the impact of our operations on our neighbours as much as possible, and with our partners at the City of Toronto, we are working on several safety improvements along Manse Road, Copperfield Road and the crossing itself so we can reinstate whistle cessation at this crossing as soon as it is safe to do so.
