Land Acknowledgement

Let us take a moment to acknowledge we are on lands that have been, and continue to be, home to many Indigenous Peoples including the Anishnabeg, the Haudenosaunee and the Huron-Wendat peoples.

Community Liaison Committee

Community Liaison Committees (CLC) provide a forum for open, two-way communication and sharing of information between the community and Metrolinx. It serves as for forum to learn about community perspectives, concerns, and questions, and to foster a collaborative approach during the course of the project.

- The CLC will meet regularly (cadence to be determined by consensus).
- Metrolinx will propose meeting agenda with input from committee members.
- Meetings will be approximately 60-90 minutes.
- Metrolinx will chair the CLC.
- Action items to be logged in meeting minutes for follow-up.






A Launchpad to Explore the Region

- A new transit hub at Bridge Station will open up new travel possibilities in York Region and beyond.
- Brings convenient transit access to the heart of the Richmond Hill Centre and Langstaff Gateway development areas
- This will lead to less traffic congestion as these communities grow
- Offers fast and convenient transfers to as many as seven existing and future regional transit lines

Recent Milestones & Progress

Finch Early Works - Near Completion

- Initial project to prepare existing Finch station for future subway tunneling
- Restoration of temporary traffic signals, pedestrian walkway and Yonge-Hendon intersection underway
- Success using the noise monitoring system- team alerted of any instances of exceedance allowing prompt inspection and resolution of the issue
 - Zero noise complaints received during duration of the project

Advanced Utility Works Relocations

- Utility relocations along Yonge Street are ongoing to prepare for future construction.
- Two week minimum advance notice provided
- Currently two active utility works underway in the City of Toronto and York Region.
 - Yonge-Clark; Yonge-Grandview








- The advance tunnelling RFP has been issued to three shortlisted bidders asking them to submit formal proposals on how they would design, build and finance tunnelling work for the project.
 - CrossTransit Group
- North End Connectors
- Tunnelling work will begin after we finalize a detailed schedule with our future tunnelling team. We expect to name a successful bidder in late 2024

<u>Scope</u>

- •Twin bore tunnels, including two tunnel boring machines
- Headwalls (stations, emergency exit buildings)
- •Launch shaft construction (including ground improvement)
- •Extraction shaft construction (including support of excavation)
- Site restoration

PRELIMINARY SHORT-TERM PROJECT STEPS

- Advance Tunnel Contract RFP was released on December 1st, contract is to be awarded by the end of 2024.
- Project timelines related to tunnelling will be finalized with the Project Company once they are on board.
- Updates on milestones and next steps in the project will be communicated with stakeholders as they are finalized.
- Known upcoming work: ongoing environmental site assessments (e.g. groundwater sampling) and archeological assessments
 - Notices provided at least two weeks in advance, where possible


