Fencing Installation near Pape Station

Expected start date: Thursday, January 4, 2024

Expected duration: Three (3) weeks

Hours of work: Monday - Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.



What is happening?

- As early as January 4, 2024, crews will begin to install fencing around properties in the vicinity of Pape Station to secure them in advance of Ontario Line construction works.
- The site is bound by Gertrude Place in the north, Eaton Avenue in the east, Pape Station in the west and continuing south of Lipton Avenue along Eaton Avenue.
- The fencing and barriers will separate and protect the public from construction and demolition activities that will occur within these sites in the future.
- Work to install the fencing and secure the site will take place Monday to Friday between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. for approximately three (3) weeks.

What to Expect

- As part of this work, the Toronto Parking Authority lot located at 20 Eaton Avenue will be closed. In addition, the two Bike Share Toronto racks located within this parking lot will be removed and no longer in service.
 - Bike Share Toronto users can consult *bikesharetoronto.com/system-map/* for alternative bike rack locations.
- Fencing on Lipton Avenue is pending permits from the City of Toronto.
- Pedestrian access along Lipton Avenue will be maintained via a passthrough between Pape Avenue and Eaton Avenue.
- The east entrance to Pape Station on Lipton Avenue will remain open.
- TTC bus access to the Pape Station bus bay will be maintained.
- Residents and businesses may experience noise from construction equipment, including front-end loaders, trucks, augers, and hammers can be expected.
- Construction equipment and materials will be secured within the work zones.
- Signage and safety barriers will be in place to delineate work zones.
- This work may be delayed due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.
- All necessary permits have been obtained.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 40 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
