

Utility Relocations and Roadworks on Hurontario Street between Park Street and the QEW

January to December 2023



What work is taking place?

Construction crews continue to upgrade and relocate important utility infrastructure in Mississauga South, in advance of road widening for LRT guideway construction that is expected later this year. This includes the commissioning of new watermains, and the installation of new stormwater, electrical and telecommunications infrastructure along Hurontario Street between Park Street and the QEW.

Following the installation of Alectra duct banks and new hydro poles, crews will work with Alectra on switching over adjacent properties to the new power connections. The relocation of telecommunications infrastructure for Bell and Rogers will follow. Construction will also be staged on the west side of Hurontario Street with active lanes of traffic on the east side. Once the new storm water infrastructure is installed along the west side of Hurontario Street, this staging will allow for the completion of the flood walls and new bridge structure over Mary Fix Creek, connecting Eaglewood Boulevard in the east with Oriole Avenue in the west. The Inglewood Drive intersection will be decommissioned once the new intersection at Eaglewood Boulevard is complete.

Most work is scheduled on Monday-Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and takes place within the staged area delineated by traffic control barrels and temporary fencing. Additional notification will be provided when there is a requirement for a temporary road closure, overnight, or Sunday work. We will also communicate with individual property owners concerning potential property access requirements such as temporary driveway closures or utility connections. These works are only planned when required to complete the work efficiently and safely. Additional signage will also be placed to update motorists and pedestrians.

TIMING

- Regular work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday.
- We will provide further notification to residents if work is scheduled overnight and on weekends.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching work zones.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, triaxles, backhoes,

and other construction equipment related to this work.

- We will with individual property owners concerning potential property access requirements such as temporary driveway closures or utility connections.
