
Track Installation and OCS Pole Installations on Hurontario Street between Eglinton Avenue and the 407 ETR

January 2024 to the end of December 2024



What work is taking place?

As construction on the Hazel McCallion Line Light Rail Transit progresses, crews will continue with track installation along the centre of Hurontario Street. Area residents and businesses can expect to see OCS pole installations on both sides of Hurontario Street in 2024. Other activities include:

- Installation of canopies at LRT stops.
- Completion of wet and dry utility upgrades
- Installation of Traction Power Substation Units (TPSS) units, used to supply power to the Light Rail Vehicles (LRVs)

These works will be followed by landscaping and beautification along the multi-use paths, curbs, and boulevards.

Most work is scheduled from Monday to Saturday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and will take place within the staged area in the centre of the roadway. Some overnight and weekend work may also be required. Additional notification will be provided when there is a requirement for a temporary road closure, overnight, or Sunday work. We will also communicate with individual property owners concerning potential property access requirements such as utility connections and temporary driveway closures for final restoration and boulevard grading. Additional signage will also be placed to inform motorists and pedestrians about any sidewalk closures or changes to traffic configuration.

As construction continues, we remind the motorists that permanent turning restrictions will be implemented to ensure the safe flow of traffic. This means that left turns will be restricted to signalized intersections. Entering and exiting properties along Hurontario Street will require motorists to make right turns.

TIMING

- Regular work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Saturday.
- We will provide further notification to residents if work is scheduled overnight and on Sundays.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Property access will be mostly limited to right in/right out vehicular movements.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching work zones.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, triaxles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

• We will reach out to impacted property owners concerning potential property access requirements such as temporary driveway closures or utility connections.
