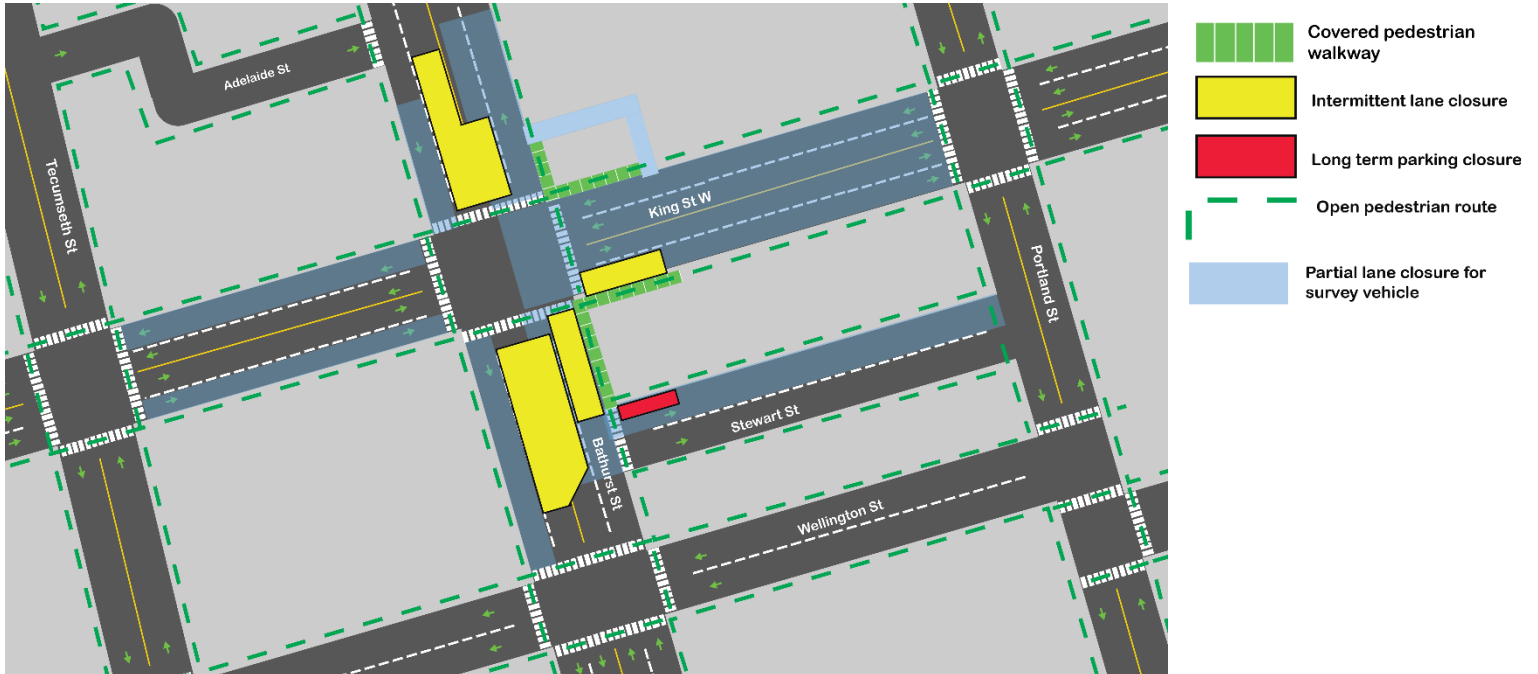


# UPDATED: Overnight sewer and utility surveying near King Street West and Bathurst Street

**Expected Start Date:** As early as, February 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

**Expected End Date:** April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

**Planned work hours:** Overnight from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Daytime from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.



## What is happening?

- Construction crews will continue to survey and monitor utilities and conduct sewer inspections at various points around the future King Bathurst Station as shown in yellow on the map above.
- Crews will rotate between locations shown on the map and each investigation will take one or two nights to complete the work.
- Temporary lane closures are required for crews to safely carry out the survey work.
- The work is done by accessing sewer manholes to assess internal conditions of sewers and
- cabling before station construction begins.
- Crews will drill into the road to inspect utilities under the roadway. Once complete, the drilled areas will be restored.
- Equipment such as a saw cutter and a hydrovac truck may be used.

## What to expect

- Work will take place during the daytime between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., or in the overnight period between 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. depending on road conditions and permissions.
- Temporary lane restrictions north and southbound on Bathurst St and King St will be in effect.
- All pedestrian access is expected to be maintained in both directions, with the use of walkways where sidewalks are closed.
- Barriers will be used to separate pedestrian passageways from active traffic lanes.
- A traffic control person will be at each closure guiding traffic.
- Residents will hear noise from work equipment.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
