
Construction of ramp for future relocation of TTC stop on Queen Street West, west of Spadina Avenue

Expected preparation work start date: February 14, 2024 **Expected duration of preparation work:** Three days (through February 16, 2024) **Hours of work:** 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

What is happening?

- The station site for the future Queen-Spadina south entrance is advancing. To create a safe and accessible space for continued use of the Queen West eastbound streetcar, crews will install a ramp on Queen Street West at the site of the relocated TTC stop.
- The new stop will be located in the vicinity of 481 Queen Street West, west of the current stop.
- This preparation work is expected to start as early as February 14, 2024, and will take approximately three days to complete.
- The TTC stop will be moved for the duration of construction activities at the future Queen-Spadina station site.



What can I expect?

- Crews will begin work to install a new access ramp for the relocated eastbound TTC stop on February 14, 2024. Traffic barriers will be placed in the eastbound curb lane on Queen Street West to protect the work zone.
- Ramp installation is expected to take place between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. for three days. Crews may be onsite prior to 7:00 a.m. to prepare to work.
- During this work, the eastbound curb lane on Queen Street West will be partially closed, and south sidewalk on Queen Street West will be temporarily reduced. Pedestrian passage will be maintained with the use of barriers to separate pedestrians from active work zones.
- Crews will be using saws to cut and remove existing concrete from the curb, as well as pouring concrete to refinish the sidewalk. Community members may hear some noise from construction, in addition to seeing trucks and equipment in the area.
- Upon completion, traffic barriers will be removed.
- The relocated TTC stop at the corner of Queen Street West and Spadina Avenue will be placed in service following inspection and final approvals.
- The following TTC routes will be accessible at the new stop:
 - o Line 301
 - o Line 501B
- The stop is expected to return to its original location once construction of the future Queen-Spadina station structure is complete.
- Signage will be posted advising pedestrians and motorists of the sidewalk and lane restrictions, as well as the relocated TTC transit stop.
- Transit services and access to local residential and commercial units will be maintained at all times.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
