

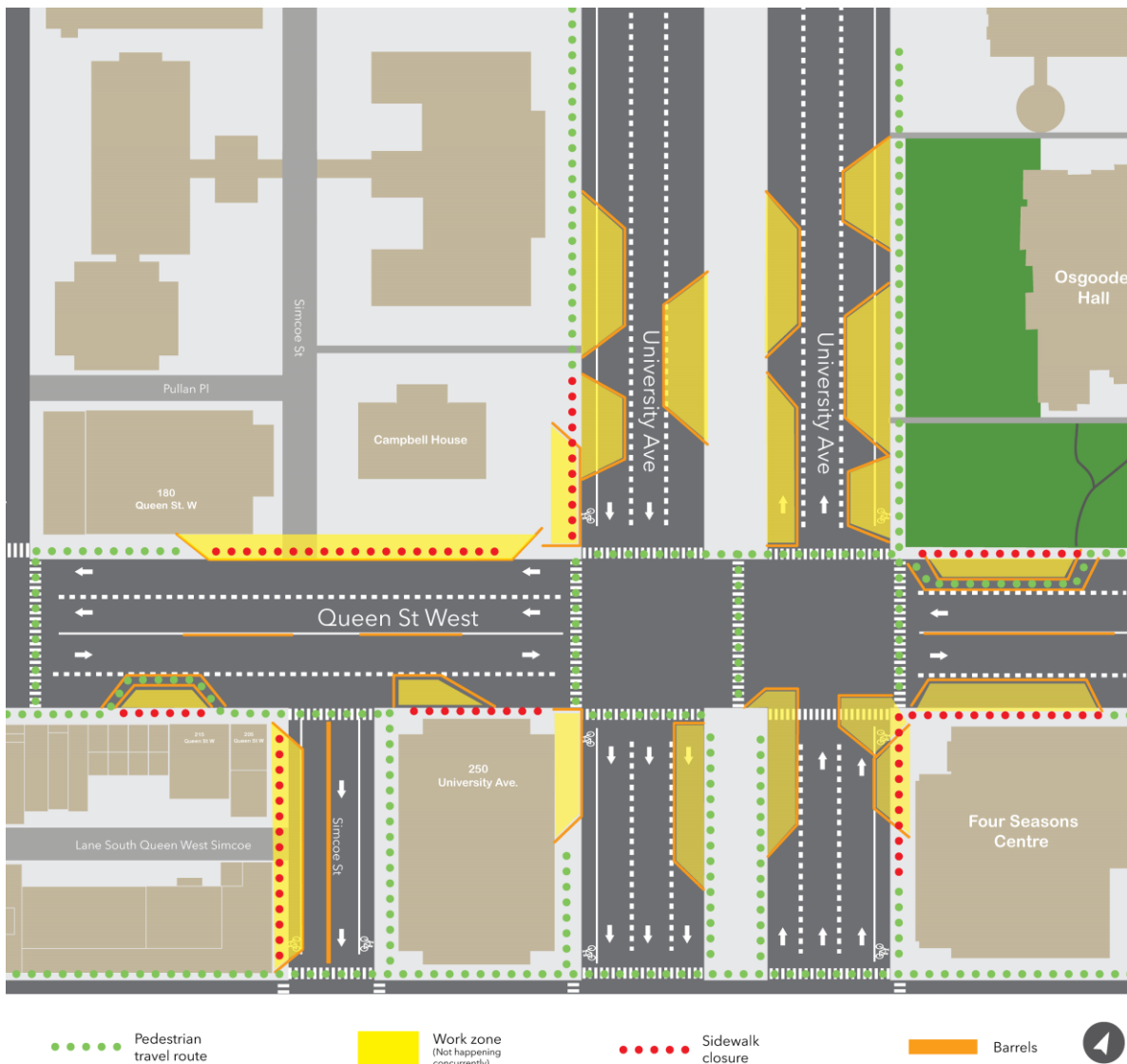
Monitoring device installations near Queen Street West - University Avenue - Simcoe Street

Expected start date: As early as February 20, 2024

Expected duration: End of May, 2024

Hours of work: Overnight, Monday to Friday, from 7:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

What is happening?

- Construction crews will be conducting monitoring device installations in the areas shown in yellow on the map above.
- For investigative works, drilling is necessary to test and visualize the utilities and ground conditions under the street for future construction of the Ontario Line subway tunnels and Osgoode Stations.
- Temporary lane and sidewalk closures are required for crews to safely carry out their work.
- Crews will complete each segment of work independently, moving within the various locations identified on the map.
- Intermittent closures of sidewalks and traffic lanes around active work zones are expected.

What to expect

- The work is scheduled to begin as early as February 20, 2024, and anticipated to be completed within three (3) months.
- Work will take place during overnight, Monday to Friday, between 7:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.
- Crews are expected to be onsite prior to 7:00 a.m. to set up equipment.
- Area residents and businesses can expect to hear noise from work equipment, specifically hydrovac trucks and saw cutting tools as required. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- All closures for work (as noted in the map above) are temporary and intermittent as work is performed.
- Areas will only be closed while crews are surveying the specific areas.
- Barriers will be placed to separate pedestrians from live traffic and active work zones.
- Flag-persons and paid duty officers will be present to guide traffic and pedestrians in safety, as required.
- Access to area residential and commercial units will be maintained.
- Signage will be posted advising pedestrians and motorists of the sidewalk and lane restrictions.

- Transit services will be always maintained.
- After each work shift, each area will be securely covered and marked for safety until workers return or the work is complete. The areas will be returned to public use upon completion of the monitoring device installation.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
