Monitoring device installations: Queen Street West (daytime)

Expected start date: As early as February 22, 2024 **Duration:** Up to two (2) months **Hours of work:** Weekdays (Monday to Friday), from_7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

What is happening?

- Crews are conducting investigative utility works and drilling (in the area shown in yellow on the map above) on Queen Street.
- Work crews will install and perform maintenance on an underground monitoring device.
- For investigative works, drilling is necessary to test and visualize the utilities and ground conditions under the street for future construction of the Ontario Line subway tunnels at Osgoode Station.

What to expect

- The work is scheduled to be extended until the end of April 2024.
- Work will take place during the day on weekdays, between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Crews are expected to be onsite prior to 7:00 a.m. to set up equipment.
- Community members can expect to hear noise from work equipment, specifically hydrovac trucks and saw cutting tools, as required.
- Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- Closure for work is temporary and intermittent: area will only be closed while crews are surveying the specific area. The area will be returned to public use upon completion of the monitoring device installation.

Queen Street West intermittent partial closure (as noted in the map above):

- Work will be intermittent, moving between work zones as required.
- The westbound curb lane and eastbound curb lane on Queen Street West will be closed during active work in each area.
- The pedestrian walkway and workzone will be protected by barriers to ensure safety access for pedestrians along the work area.
- Flag-persons will be present to guide traffic at each side of the work zone area.
- Signage will be posted advising of the lane road and sidewalk restrictions.

Information as of February 16, 2024

Note: Access may resume prior to 7:00 p.m. if works are completed ahead of schedule.

- After each work shift, each area will be securely covered and marked for safety until workers return or the work is complete.
- The areas will be returned to public use upon completion of the monitoring device installation.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
