
Update: Overnight civil work in the Don Yard

Expected start date and duration:

Overnight work will continue to take place Sunday - Friday, between 8 p.m. - 5 a.m., through Spring 2024



What is happening?

Information as of: March 6, 2024



- Overnight construction work will continue to take place in the Don Yard through Spring 2024.
- Construction activities will include excavation, grading, surfacing, drilling, track installations, electrical installations, and structural works.
- This work is being done to prepare for the commissioning of new tracks and train signals that will be put into service in April and May 2024.
- To minimize noise disruption, crews will endeavour to perform noisier work such as excavation and surfacing during the daytime hours.
- Noise mitigation measures will be implemented as required during the day and overnight.
- Overnight work is required to complete construction activities that workers cannot do safely while trains are active and running in the rail corridor.

What to expect

- Noise from construction equipment including a hydro-vacuum truck, excavator, lift, tamper, loaders, and grading equipment (trucks).
- Site lighting will be required and will be positioned away from residential properties.
- A hydro-vacuum truck will be required to safely carry out this work due to the limited space between the construction works and the existing buried utilities.
- Crews must use non-mechanical excavation methods (hydro-vacuuming) when working within 2 meters of buried utilities to ensure public and worker safety and protect the utilities from damage.
- Trucks will enter and exit the site via Lakeshore Boulevard east of Cherry Street.
- No significant traffic or pedestrian impacts are expected as a result of this work.
- This work will allow crews to realign train tracks and signals to make way for the Ontario Line.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
