
Overnight weekend construction in the Don Yard

Overnight work will take place on the following weekends:

- Friday, April 5 Sunday, April 7, 2024
- Friday, April 19 Sunday, April 21, 2024
- Friday, May 3 Sunday, May 5, 2024

What is happening?

- Continuous overnight weekend work will take place in the Don Yard on three weekends between April May 2024 to complete significant testing and commissioning work.
- The table below provides further details on the work schedule, activities, and locations.

Dates	Construction activities	Approx. work area (refer to map above)
Friday April 5 - Sunday April 7, 2024	Testing and commissioning two railway signal boxes	South of the existing train tracks
Friday April 19 - Sunday April 21, 2024	Realigning and commissioning a new train track	North of the existing train tracks
Friday May 3 - Sunday May 5, 2024	Installing, testing and commissioning a new train signal bridge	West of the existing bridge that crosses over the Don Valley Parkway

- To minimize noise disruption, crews will endeavour to complete heavy civil and track work such as excavation, grading, rail cutting, placing rail ties, surfacing, and drilling during the day before each weekend.
- The Lakeshore East GO rail corridor needs to be closed to safely complete this work. GO train service will be affected. For further details, please review the Transit Information section below.
- Work will be executed on a 24-hour basis to ensure that all necessary construction activities are completed when trains are not running.

What to expect

- Noise from construction equipment including a hydro-vacuum truck, excavator, lift, tamper, loaders, and grading equipment (trucks).
- Site lighting will be required and will be positioned away from residential properties.
- A hydro-vacuum truck will be required to safely carry out this work due to the limited space between the construction works and the existing buried utilities.
- Crews must use non-mechanical excavation methods (hydro-vacuuming) when working within 2 meters of buried utilities to ensure public and worker safety and protect the utilities from damage.
- Trucks will enter and exit the site via Lakeshore Boulevard, east of Cherry Street.
- No significant traffic or pedestrian impacts are expected as a result of this work.
- Noise mitigation measures will be implemented as required during the day and overnight.
- The existing train tracks and signals will be realigned to make way for Ontario Line construction.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Transit Information

Friday April 5 - Sunday April 7, 2024

- Stouffville line customers: GO trains will only run between Old Elm GO and Kennedy GO station Sat. April 6 and Sun. April 7. There will be no Stouffville line train service to or from Union Station. Use TTC services to travel between Union Station and Kennedy GO to connect to/from the GO train.
- Lakeshore East customers: After 10 p.m. Fri. April 5 and throughout the weekend Sat. & Sun. April 6 & 7, we are adjusting train service so we can safely complete some key infrastructure updates on the Lakeshore East line. GO trains will be running every 30-minutes between Durham College Oshawa GO and Danforth GO.

Friday April 19 - Sunday April 21, 2024

- Lakeshore West train service will operate on an hourly schedule.
- For those who normally connect from the Lakeshore East service to travel west, not all trains will continue past Union Station.
- GO bus 21 connections will be adjusted.
- Some late-night rail service on Friday, April 19 will also be adjusted.

Friday May 3 - Sunday May 5, 2024

• Stouffville service will operate between Kennedy and Mount Joy/Old Elm, with TTC connections at Kennedy station into Union Station.
