

Land Acknowledgment


Let us take a moment to acknowledge we are on lands that have been, and continue to be, home to many Indigenous Peoples including the Anishnabeg, the Haudenosaunee and the Huron-Wendat peoples.

We are all Treaty people. Many of us have come here as settlers, as immigrants or involuntarily as part of the trans-Atlantic slave trade, in this generation, or generations past.

SAFETY MOMENT - SPRING FLOODING AWARENESS

Spring weather is just around the corner in Toronto, bringing warmer temperatures and new opportunities for recreational activities. However, it's essential to be mindful of safety during this season.

- Riverbanks: In spring, riverbanks can become slippery and unstable due to snowmelt and erosion. Keep your family and pets away from the surfaces and edges of all bodies of water to prevent accidents.
- **Bodies of Water:** Avoid activities in or around water bodies, especially near ice-covered rivers and streams. If you're traveling north of the GTHA, do not attempt to walk or drive on ice-covered water.
- **Remember that melting snow**, combined with spring rainfall and frozen ground conditions, could lead to higher and faster flowing water in watercourses. Stay clear to keep safe!























Piling Activity





Future South station entrance



Focus on future South entrance








REDUCING IMPACTS

To reduce impacts to residents and businesses in the area, mitigations will be in place including:

- Noise and vibration monitoring sites placed on site and in the neighborhood for active tracking of impact to ambient noise levels
- Trucks and equipment will drive on top of a granular platform to minimize dust. In warmer and dry months, water will be spread to help with dust. Adjacent roads will also be cleaned once excavated material is starting to be hauled off.
- Daytime work hours for current phase of work (7 a.m. to 7 p.m.)
- Continuous loop truck routes, reducing need for trucks to reverse using backup alarms
- Site hoarding where possible to help reduce noise
