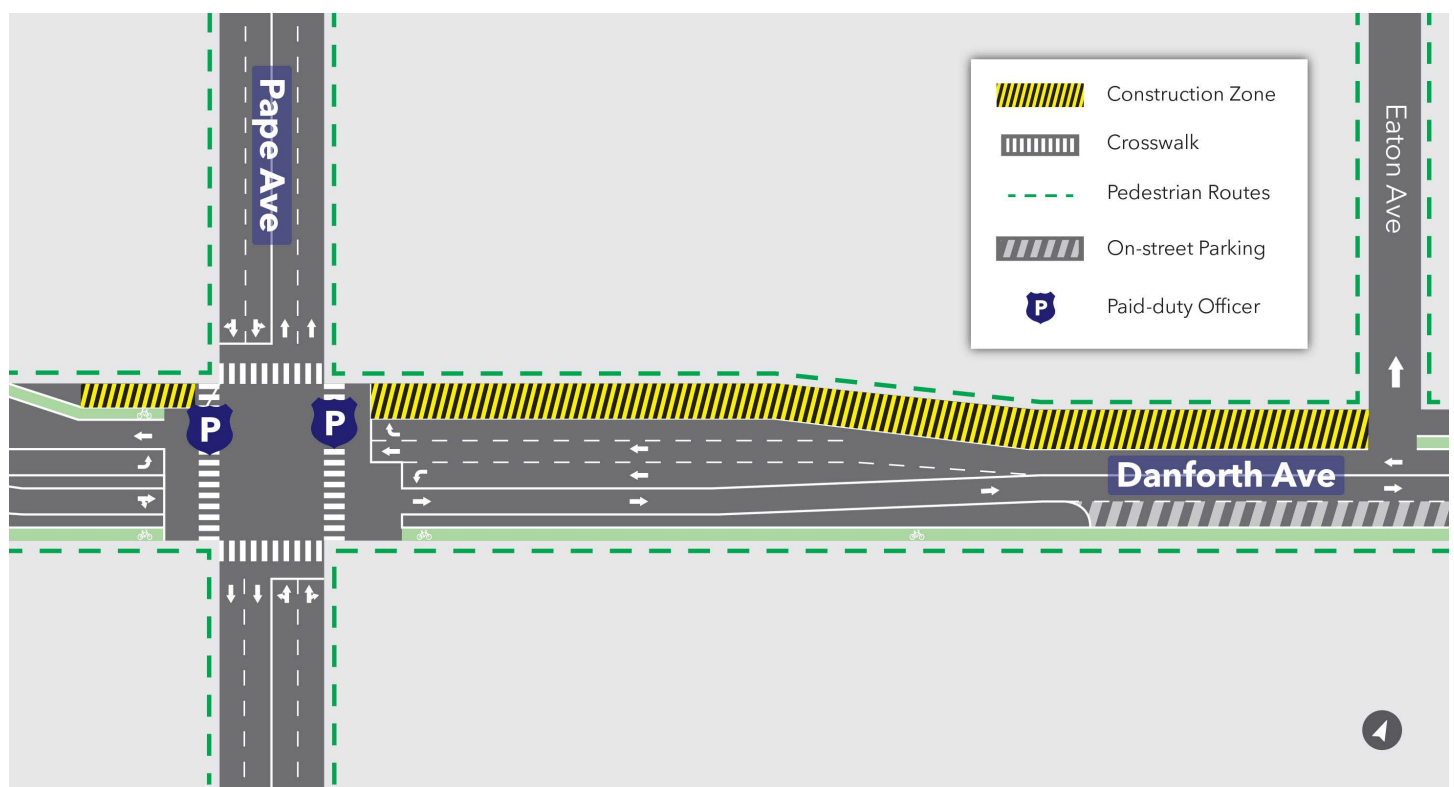


Cable Pulling and Toronto Hydro Excavation on Danforth Avenue

Expected start date: As early as March 11, 2024

Expected completion date: Mid-June, 2024

Hours of work: Weekdays, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.



What is happening?

- To accommodate future excavation and construction of Pape Station on the Ontario Line, Rogers Communications and Toronto Hydro will be moving underground utilities in the vicinity of the station site.
- Rogers will be pulling cable through existing manholes in on the north side of Danforth Avenue from Eaton Avenue to just west of Pape Avenue.
- Toronto Hydro will be pulling cables and performing excavation within the same footprint following the completion of the Rogers cable pulls.

What to expect

- Work on Rogers cable pulling will begin as early as March 11, 2024.
 - Crews will set up in the curb lane and access manholes along the road.
 - This stage will take approximately one (1) week to complete.
- Work on Toronto Hydro cable pulling and excavation will begin as early as March 18, 2024.
 - Crews will occupy the same footprint as Rogers within the westbound curb lane.
 - Hydro cable pulling will take approximately eight (8) weeks and will be followed by approximately four (4) weeks of excavation and more cable pulling
- Work will take place from Monday-Friday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Residents and businesses in the area may hear noise caused by work equipment. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- The work zone will occupy westbound lanes on Danforth Avenue, including a portion of the on-street parking lane. One lane of traffic will be maintained in both directions for the duration of this work.
- The westbound bicycle lane will be occupied for this work. Cyclists will be provided with a dedicated lane where it is possible, if not cyclists will merge into the westbound traffic lane to continue west to Pape Avenue.
- Paid-duty officers will be on-site to assist with traffic flow as necessary.
- There will be no sidewalk impacts from this work.

Note:

- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
