

UPDATED: Construction hoarding installation at Queen and Spadina

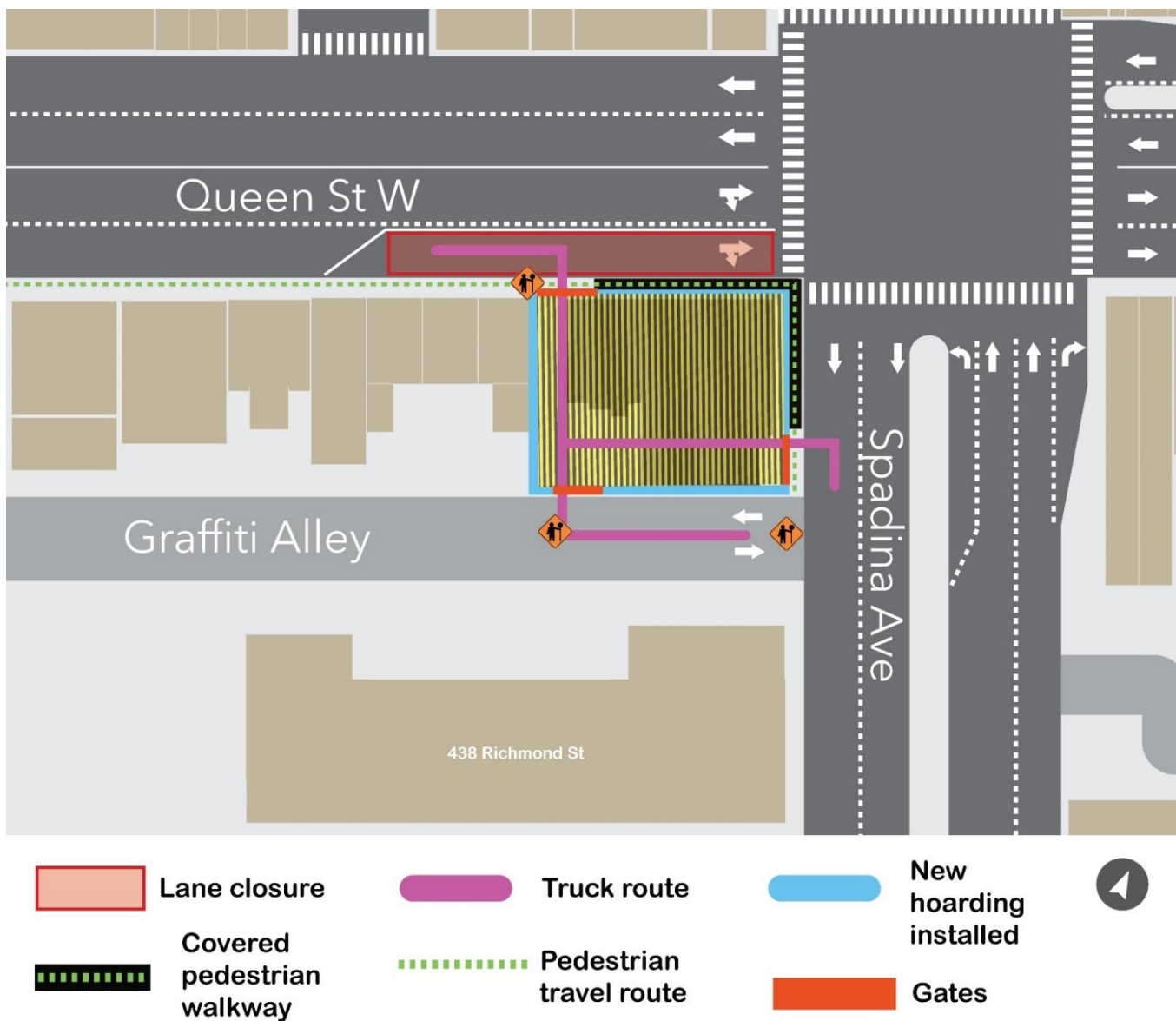
Expected start date: On-going as of late February 2024

Expected duration of preparation work: Up to March 30, 2024

Hours of work:

- Weekdays, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Saturday March 14, 2024 and Saturday March 23, 2024: 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

What is happening?

- To prepare for construction of the future Ontario Line subway at Queen and Spadina, construction crews will install new fencing and plywood hoarding in the future South entrance site, to protect the public from the work zone.
- This work started on February 26, 2024, and will take approximately one month to complete. To advance the work, additional crews will undertake work on up to two Saturdays in March.
- Plywood hoarding is a safety measure to ensure the protection of the public during construction. It also helps with the transfer of noise from the site to the neighbourhood.

What can I expect?

- Crews began this work in late February and are expected to complete the first phase of work by March 30, 2024.
- Work will start in Graffiti Alley, then proceed to the west side of the site. Once complete, crews will replace existing hoarding on Queen Street West and then Spadina Avenue, as indicated as the blue line in the map above.
- Panels are expected to be about 3 meters high.
- Pedestrian traffic will be maintained through the pedestrian protected walkway, as indicated on the map above, and transit services and access to local residential and commercial units will be maintained.
- Community members will see trucks delivering plywood hoarding materials, and crews working to install the walls. Some noise may occur from construction equipment, including front-end loaders, trucks, and hammers.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
