

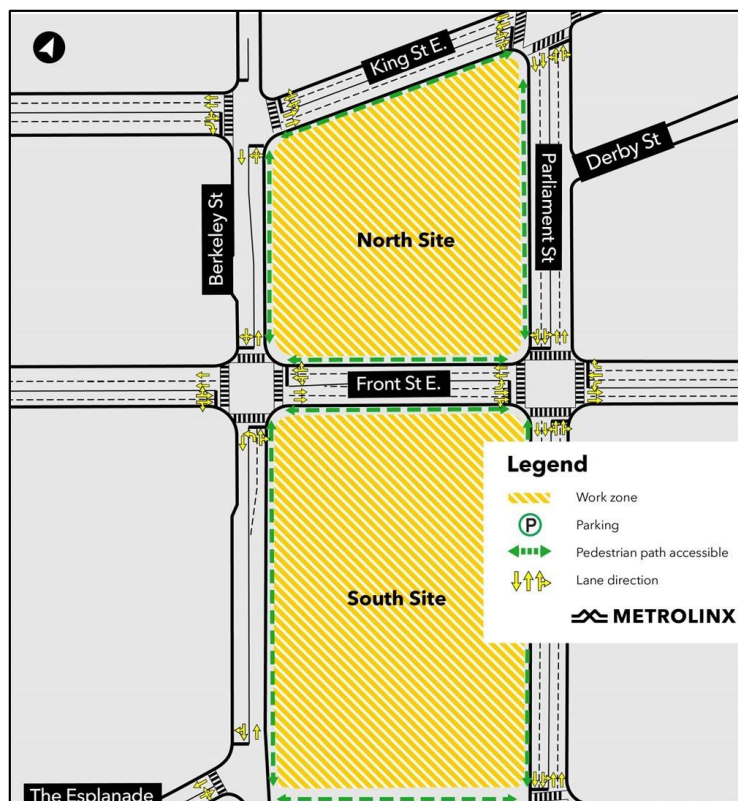
Update on archaeological investigations at the Corktown south site

Expected start date: As early as March 18, 2024

Expected duration: 4 weeks

Hours of work: Monday to Saturday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

What is happening?

- Archaeological investigations, required by the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM), continue at the south site location (265 Front Street East) and are expected to be completed by late Spring 2024.
- As early as Monday, March 18, 2024, archaeological crews will remove portions of the existing construction hoarding and install metal fencing in its place, in order to facilitate excavation right to the property edge.

What to expect

- Archaeological crews will be working on the northwest corner of the south site at 265 Front Street from Monday to Saturday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. There will be no Sunday work.
- Crews will be temporarily removing construction hoarding and replacing it with metal fencing along the sidewalk resulting in a narrower sidewalk route for pedestrians. Work will occur throughout the four week period daily along segments of the existing hoarding. Mechanical and hand excavation will take place on the other side of the fencing but will not modify the sidewalk itself.
- Noise levels are not expected to increase from current levels.
- Indigenous groups are aware of the ongoing work and will continue to provide archaeological monitoring as available.
- All roads in the area will remain open.
- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to unforeseen delays or weather conditions.
