
Geotechnical drilling and demolition update at Sammon Avenue and Pape Avenue

Expected start date: As early as April 2, 2024

Expected duration: One (1) month

Hours of work: Monday - Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.



What is happening?

To accommodate construction activities for the Ontario Line, crews will perform
geotechnical drilling works within the site outlined in the map above. Following the
drilling, the buildings on the properties will be abated and demolished. These buildings
are on Metrolinx-owned properties.

- Crews will use geotechnical drilling to learn about the conditions of the soil under the site prior to digging. The drills will obtain a deep sample of the soil that will allow engineers to evaluate the soil type, consistency, moisture levels, density, and other information needed for the project.
- Starting as early as Tuesday, April 2, 2024, crews will begin geotechnical drilling works to assess the ground conditions of the site. All drilling will be conducted within the site boundaries.
- Starting as early as Friday, April 5, 2024, crews will begin the abatement and demolition of the buildings on the properties at 891, 887, and 885 Pape Ave.
- The buildings will be prepared prior to demolition with the removal of interior details.
- All work will take place Monday to Friday between 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for approximately one (1) month.

What to expect

- Work will begin with geotechnical drilling and be followed by demolition.
- Noise from drilling can be expected.
- During demolition, noise from construction equipment including excavators, bobcats, and dump trucks can be expected.
- Short-term traffic interruptions can be expected while trucks and equipment enter and exit work zones; traffic control personnel will be present to direct vehicles and pedestrians.
- Construction equipment and materials will be secured within the work zones.
- Signage and safety barriers will be in place to delineate work zones.
- This work may be delayed due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 40 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
