UPDATE: Overnight Geotechnical Monitoring Point Installations at Pape and Danforth

Expected start date: As early as April 16, 2024

Expected duration: Five (5) days

Timing: April 16-18: Overnights, 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.

April 20: 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. April 21: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

What is happening?

- On April 16, crews will return to Danforth Avenue to complete geotechnical monitoring point installations.
- From April 16-18, crews will work overnight on the north side of Danforth Avenue between Pape Avenue and Eaton Avenue.
- On April 20 and 21, crews will occupy the centre of Danforth Avenue east of the Pape and Danforth intersection. Bi-directional traffic will be maintained around the work zone.
- These points will be used to monitor underground utilities and groundwater pressure and levels during Ontario Line construction.
- Monitoring points will be installed in-ground within the roadway the areas shown above in red.
- All necessary permits have been obtained and works will be monitored by Metrolinx representatives to ensure compliance.

What to expect

 Monitoring point installation will involve the use of hand tools, a mobile drill, a coring truck, and a hydro-vac excavator.

- Work from April 16-18 will take place overnight to reduce traffic impacts. Traffic will alternate in a single lane south of the work zone, controlled by a flag person on either side.
- Work on April 20 and 21 will take place during the day. Bi-directional traffic will flow around the work zone in the centre of Danforth Avenue, with a paid-duty officer ensuring safe flow at the Pape and Danforth intersection.
- Following installation, crews will be visiting each monitoring point on a bi-weekly basis to gather data until summer 2024.
- Work will require crews to occupy street parking spots. "No Parking" signs will be posted in advance.
- Residents may experience noise from work equipment.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.
