
Monitoring device installations: King Street East, Front Street East, and Berkeley Street

Expected start date: As early as May 8, 2024 **Duration:** Up to three months **Hours of work:** Weekdays (Monday-Friday), 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

What is happening?

- Construction crews will be conducting monitoring device installations in the areas shown in yellow on the map above.
- Temporary lane and sidewalk closures are required for crews to safely carry out their work.
- Crews will complete different segments of work, moving within the various locations identified on the map. Intermittent closures of sidewalks and traffic lanes around active work zones to be expected.
- For investigative works, drilling is necessary to test and visualize the utilities and ground conditions under the street for future construction of the Ontario Line subway tunnels and Corktown Stations.

What to expect

- The work is scheduled to begin as early as May 8, and is anticipated to be completed within three months.
- Work will take place during the weekdays, (Monday-Friday), between 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Crews are expected to be onsite prior to 9:00 a.m. to set-up equipment.

- Area residents and businesses can expect to hear noise from work equipment, specifically hydrovac trucks and saw cutting tools as required. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- All closures for work are temporary and intermittent; areas will only be closed while crews are surveying the specific areas. The areas will be returned to public use upon completion of the monitoring device installation.

King Street East intermittent partial closures (as noted in the map):

- The westbound curb lane and centre lanes east of Berkeley Street.
- Barriers will be placed to separate pedestrians and vehicles from the active work zones.

Front Street East intermittent partial closures (as noted in the map):

- The westbound centre lane east of Berkeley Street.
- The eastbound curb and centre lanes east and west of Berkeley Street.
- The south sidewalk east and west of Berkeley Street.
- Paid duty officers will be present to guide pedestrians and traffic at Berkeley Street.
- Barriers will be placed to separate pedestrians and vehicles from the active work zones.

Berkeley Street intermittent partial closures (as noted in the map):

- The northbound curb lane north of Front Street East. The northbound curb and centre lanes south of King Street East and south of Front Street East.
- Paid duty officers will be present to assist motorists at Front Street East and Berkeley Street.
- The west and east sidewalks south of Front Street East.
- Flag-persons will be present to guide pedestrians through the designated detour routes.
- Pedestrian access will be maintained with the use of barriers to separate pedestrians from live traffic and active work zones between King Street East and Front Street East.

Note: Access may resume prior to 5:00 p.m. if works are completed ahead of schedule.

- Transit services will be maintained at all times.
- Two-way traffic will be maintained at all times in the east, west, north and south directions.
- Access to area residential and commercial units will be maintained.
- Signage will be posted advising of the sidewalk and lane restrictions.
- After each work shift, each area will be securely covered and marked for safety until workers return or the work is complete. The areas will be returned to public use upon completion of the monitoring device installation.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
