
# Abutment demolition at the Dundas Street East and Logan Avenue bridges

## **Expected start dates:**

- Dundas St. E. Bridge: As early as Monday, May 13, 2024
- Logan Ave. Bridge: As early as Monday, May 27, 2024

**Expected duration:** Demolition work will take place periodically over three weeks at each bridge

**Hours of work:** Monday - Friday, from 7 a.m. - 5 p.m. and periodically on Saturdays from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.



### What is happening?

- Starting in mid-May 2024, the bridge abutments at Dundas St. E. and Logan Ave. will be demolished and removed.
- Abutments are the structures located at each end of a bridge, that connect the bridge to the ground, and support the weight of the bridge deck.



• Alternating sidewalk closures on Dundas St. E. and Logan Ave. will be required to complete this work safely.

### Traffic and pedestrian details

- Sidewalk closures on Dundas St. E. and Logan Ave. will be required at the bridges to complete this work safely; **one sidewalk will remain open at all times.**
- Sidewalk closures will alternate depending on the side of the bridge where work is occurring.
- Crews will do their best to reopen the sidewalks at the end of each workday.
- Pedestrians are encouraged to cross at designated crosswalks only and follow construction signage posted in the area.
- Existing traffic lane reductions for pier construction work will remain in place.
- Cyclists will need to share the road with vehicles while travelling through this area. Share the road signs will be posted to guide cyclists. Drivers are reminded to slow down and allow cyclists to safely merge into the traffic lane. Do not attempt to pass cyclists.
- Traffic may be stopped for short durations during lifting operations or to facilitate the safe entry/egress of construction equipment.
- One traffic lane in each direction will be maintained on Dundas St. E. and Logan Ave.

## What to expect

- Construction activities will include concrete breaking, saw cutting, hammering, and hauling.
- Once the demolition work is completed, new bridge abutments will be built.
- Noise from construction equipment including excavators, saws, drill rigs, concrete trucks, dump trucks, loaders, and other heavy machinery can be expected.
- Noise mitigation measures, including noise barriers and coverings, will be implemented as required.
- Clear signage will be in place to direct vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists.
- Parking restrictions on Logan Avenue beneath the rail bridge; replacement parking is available at 10 Dickens Street.
- Traffic barrels, fencing, and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zones.
- Traffic markings will be removed and painted on the roadway as required to guide motorists and cyclists.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

### About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
