

Retention tower inspection at King St W and Bathurst St

Expected start date: As early as May 16, 2024

Expected duration: Up to 3 days

Hours of work: Daily from 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

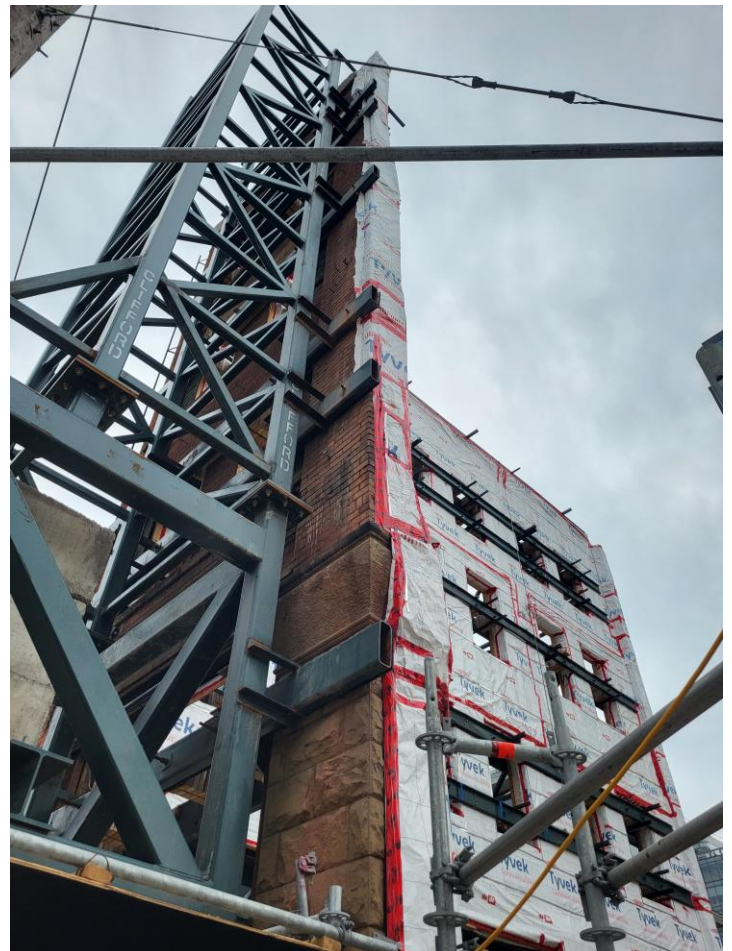
What is happening?

As part of ongoing construction of the Ontario Line and the future King-Bathurst Station, crews will be inspecting the existing retention tower, in support of the heritage façade on the southeast corner of King Street West and Bathurst Street. This inspection work will take place as early as May 16, 2024.

This visual inspection of the tower (pictured at right) is a standard safety and maintenance procedure to ensure all components of the retention tower are functioning as designed.

This inspection work is done entirely within the King-Bathurst south construction site, and will not impact traffic, vehicles, or pedestrian traffic foot traffic.

Area residents and businesses can expect to see work crews on a hydraulic lift, with nominal noise from work equipment.

What to expect

- Starting in the evening of May 16, crews will be inspecting the green retention tower at King-Bathurst, as a standard maintenance and safety procedure.
- There will be no lane or pedestrian barriers as the retention wall is inspected. A hydraulic lift will be present to assist crews in reaching the upper sections of the tower.
- This work will not generate any impactful noise.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
