

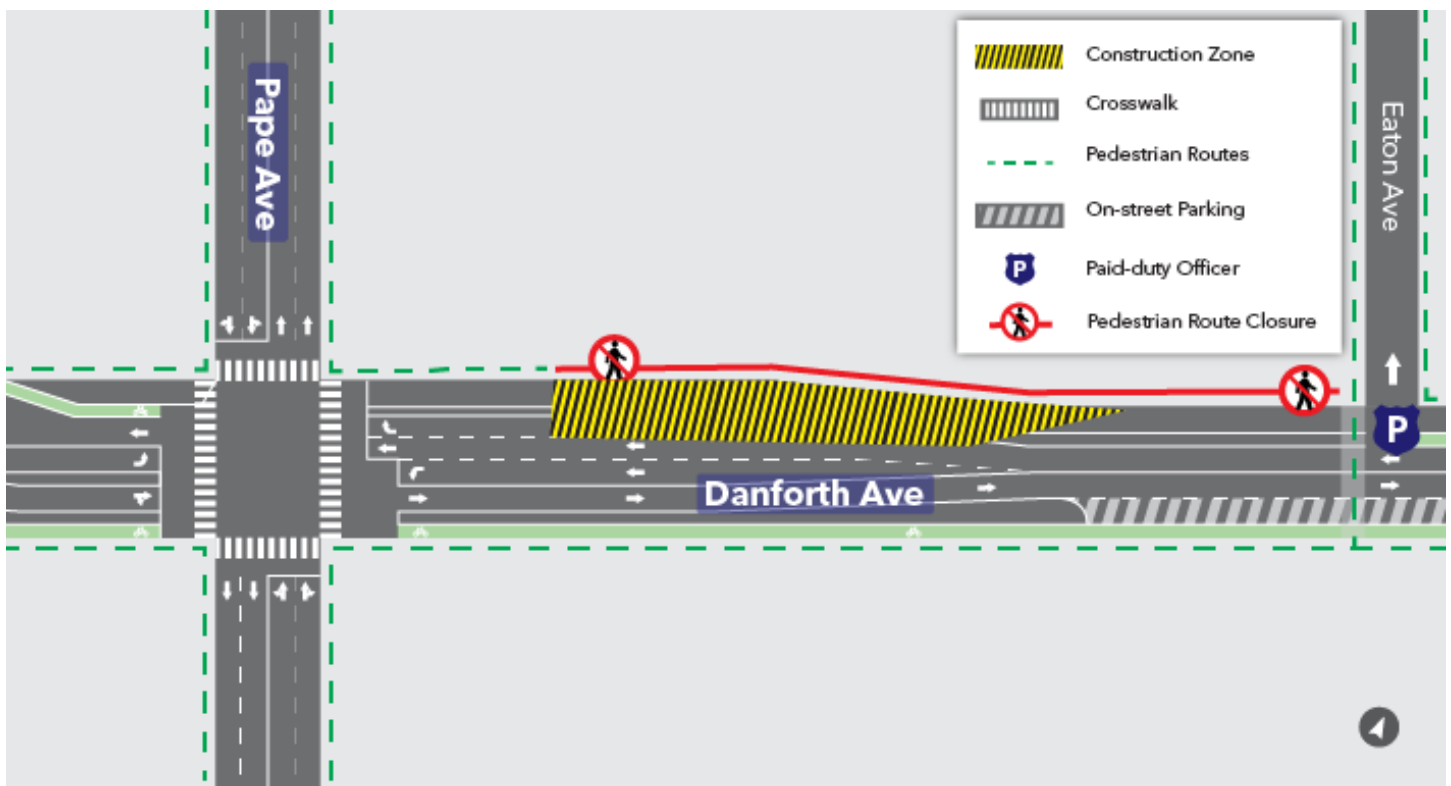
Ontario Line

Update: Cable Pulling and Toronto Hydro Excavation on Danforth Avenue

Expected start date: As early as May 20, 2024

Expected completion date: May 31, 2024

Hours of work: Weeknights, 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.



What is happening?

- To accommodate future excavation and construction of Pape Station on the Ontario Line Toronto Hydro will be moving underground utilities in the vicinity of the station site.
- Toronto Hydro will be pulling cables through existing manholes in on the north side of Danforth Avenue from Eaton Ave. to just west of Pape Ave.
- The sidewalk north side on Danforth Ave. between Pape Ave. and Eaton Ave. will be closed overnight while work is happening. It will be reopened during daytime hours.

What to expect?

- Work on Toronto Hydro cable pulling and excavation will begin as early as May 20, 2024.
 - Crews will set up in the curb lane and access manholes along the road.
 - This stage will take approximately two (2) weeks to complete.
- Crews will occupy the westbound curb lane and part of the north pedestrian sidewalk on Danforth Avenue between Pape Ave. and Eaton Ave.
- Paid-duty officers will be on-site to facilitate pedestrian crossing for the alternative route at Eaton Ave to cross Pape Ave.
- Work will take place from Monday-Friday, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- A small amount of noise will be produced by a fan used for underground ventilation. The remainder of the work is not expected to create noise.
- The work zone will occupy westbound lanes on Danforth Avenue, including a portion of the on-street parking lane. One lane of traffic will be maintained in both directions for the duration of this work.
- The westbound bicycle lane will be occupied for this work. Cyclists will be provided with a dedicated lane where it is possible, if not cyclists will merge into the westbound traffic lane to continue west to Pape Avenue.

Note:

- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
