#### **Land Acknowledgment**






## York Street Trackwork




### **York Street Trackwork**

- Metrolinx continues to work with the TTC and the City of Toronto to build a permanent streetcar detour route along Adelaide and Richmond streets, connecting via York and Church streets.
- Once completed, the 501 Queen streetcar will keep riders moving during the construction of the Ontario Line subway.




#### York Street -Richmond and York

- As early as May 27, 2024, crews will begin working in the Richmond
   Street and York Street intersection. One lane westbound on Richmond
   Street will be maintained at all times.
- This specific phase of work is expected to be completed by June 7,
   2024.
- One lane northbound on York Street will be maintained.
- The eastbound and westbound curb lanes on Queen Street will remain closed. One eastbound and westbound lane on Queen Street will be maintained.
- During this closure, no left turns from Queen Street West onto York
   Street will be permitted.
- Access to parking lots and loading docks will be maintained.

### York Street Update - continued

- Over an extended weekend, Metrolinx crews will need to fully closing the York Street and Richmond Street intersection for track installation work (refer to map).
- Work is expected to begin on Friday, May 31 starting at 7am and be completed on Monday, June 3 at 7am.
- Crews will be working 24/7 to complete the work. Once completed, one lane westbound on Richmond Street will be re-opened.
- A northbound on York Street will be maintained at all times.
- The eastbound and westbound curb lanes on Queen Street will remain closed and used as a laydown area for both Metrolinx and TTC. Pedestrian access and bike lanes will be maintained.
- During this closure, no left turns from Queen Street West onto York
   Street will be permitted.
- A Paid Duty Officer will assist with traffic control and pedestrian safety.
   Right hand turns from University Avenue onto Richmond Street will be permitted for deliveries and drops offs.



### York Street - Queen and York


- As early as June 10, crews will begin working in the Richmond Street and Queen Street intersection.
- One lane westbound on Queen will be maintained at all times.
- This specific phase of work is expected to be completed by the end of July 2024.
- A northbound on York Street will be maintained at all times.
- Pedestrian access and bike lanes will be maintained.
- A Paid Duty Officer will assist with traffic control and pedestrian safety.





#### **University Avenue Median**


- Work is currently underway to realign University Avenue. This work consists of shifting traffic lanes west and is expected to be completed next month.
- Two northbound traffic lanes will remain open to vehicular traffic.
- Bike access and the pedestrian travel route will be maintained along designated routes.

#### **Future North Station Entrance**

- The Northeast corner TTC entrance at Osgoode Station is permanently closed.
- The TTC Line 1 station at Osgoode remains accessible at station and street level via three entrances on the adjacent street corners.
- Demolition of the TTC entrance and construction of the ventilation shaft will take place after the re-alignment of the road on University Avenue.

#### **Future North Station**

- Site preparation works, including asphalt paving completed.
- Permanent hoarding installation has started and expected to take three to four weeks to complete.
- Noise wall installation next to Osgoode Hall expected in July
   2024. Once timing is confirmed, more updates will be shared.

#### **Future South Station**

- A covered pedestrian walkway has been installed underneath the retention towers securing the north façade, to allow for safe pedestrian access along the Queen Street West.
- The sidewalk in front of 205 Queen Street West has reopened.
- Permanent hoarding installation is complete.
- Hoarding is expected to be painted black next, and installation of project signage is expected in June 2024.
- Current and upcoming works include the delivery of piling equipment for work to begin later this month.

#### **Piling preparation at South site**

#### **Upcoming works: Piling at the future South station entrance**

- As noted at the Piling Information Session, construction piling will begin later this month.
- During piling works, area residents and workers can expect to see trucks entering and exiting the site and will hear noise from pile drilling machines used to complete the work.
- Expected hours of work at the South site is weekdays between 7:00 a.m. to
   5:00 p.m.
- Piling work at the future North site entrance is expected to start in August
   2024. Once dates and details are confirmed, more information will be shared.

#### Site cleanliness and safety

## OTG remains committed to ensuring the site remains tidy and poses no risk and no-impact to the community at all times.

- Sidewalks and lanes around the perimeter to remain clear of debris, dirt/dust/mud during dry and wet weather.
- Graffiti monitoring will be ongoing, removal of graffiti will take place within a 48h window.
- Vandalism to exterior facilities will be repaired as soon as possible to maintain community expectations.

#### **Current Work**

#### Haul routes for South Site piling work

OTG will enforce approved haul routes for its subcontracted trades.

#### **Entrance Haul Routes**

- Trucks will proceed northbound on University Avenue and turn left onto Queen Street West, then left onto Simcoe Street.
- Alternatively, the trucks can utilize Spadina Avenue Northbound to connect with Queen Street West and Simcoe Street.

#### **Exit Haul Routes**

- The trucks will leave the site in a forward motion.
- The trucks on Simcoe Street southbound can utilize Richmond Street to connect with Spadina Avenue, or Adelaide Street to connect with University Avenue.

### **Construction Look-Ahead**

Timing	Activity	Location	Details & Purpose
Spring - Fall 2024	Piling	South + North sites	Install foundations to support future excavation of site.
Spring - Summer 2024	TTC stop Demolition	North site	Following the full realignment of University Avenue, demolition of the TTC entrance and construction of the ventilation shaft will take place.
Spring - Fall 2024	Ground Monitoring Point Installations + Investigations	Various	Ground monitoring devices will be installed at multiple sites throughout the Osgoode neighbourhood; work expected late spring to fall of 2024; more information to be shared as work is confirmed.
Fall 2024 - Winter 2024	Excavation	South + North sites	Initiate excavation of shafts to the station level, to provide connection with future station platforms.
